East-Bound Shipments. CHICAGO, Feb. 27.—The total amount of east-bound shipments last week was 59,054 tons, against 57,393 last year. The Vanderbilt lines and the Grand Trunk carried the bulk of the traffic, the latter shipping 7,233 tons, and Michigan Central 6,524 and the Grand Trunk 7,001 tons.
