THE RECORDS COMPILED BY WINTHEISER TURNED UP BY THE COUNCIL COMMITTEE.

Ald. Bradish, Woodward and McGuire Claim That His Removal Was Not Due to Political Motives—Stevens Said to Be a Competent Man—A Saving to the City.

The council committee on water works department emphatically deny that the removal of Street Foreman Wintheiser was due to political motives, or that his successor, W. H. Steffens, was given the appointment as a sop to anybody.

It is asserted that Mr. Wintheiser had been in the position so long that he had outlived his usefulness, and that the appointment of Stevens the city saves annually \$20, his salary being \$1,500 as against \$1,500.
