



A NEW LOW-PRICE RECORD.

WHEAT CLOSED IN OTHER CENT LOWER THAN ON MONDAY.

MANY CAUSES FOR THE BREAK.

Dealings on the Stock Exchange Were Heavy, With the Natural Result of Establishing a Lower Range of Quotations for a Majority of the Shares—Sugar Led the List.

CHICAGO, Feb. 6.—Wheat closed 1/4 cent lower than yesterday, and made a new low-price record for May at 62 1/2.

Wheat started weak with a loss of 1/4 cent for May at 61 1/2. The day's news was bearish, and the bulls had apparently sought cover.

The London Mark Lane Express said that the English wheat was generally liquidation. The closing cables gave evidence of continued weakness in the market across the pond, and May finished easy and 1/4 cent above the bottom.

Corn made a new record today, May selling down to 37 3/8, and July 37 1/2. The market was generally liquidation.

In oats there was a fair trade and an easier feeling, but considering the weakness in other parts of the market, prices were well maintained.

Provisions opened easy and slightly lower for pork and lard. The market for live hogs at the yards, notwithstanding a higher corn than anticipated.

Estimated receipts for tomorrow: Wheat, 23,000 bushels; corn, 105,000 bushels; hogs, 23,000 head.
