OUR MILLING INTERESTS. JOHN LIND BEFORE THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE. HE PROPOSES AN AMENDMENT

To the Tariff Bill Which Will Allow the President to Impose Retaliatory Duties on Countries That May Discriminate Against Our Wheat and Flour—Lind's strong arguments.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22.—An Representative John Lind, of Minnesota, has been in Washington several days seeking a hearing before the senate committee on finance, in behalf of the milling interests. His proposition to the finance committee was submitted in the form of an amendment, providing that the president may impose retaliatory duties on a long list of articles manufactured or produced in countries which impose prohibitory or discriminating duties upon grain, products of grain or agricultural products of the United States.

Combination of Theaters. PITTSBURGH, Pa., Feb. 22.—A combination of nine theatrical theaters was formed in Pittsburgh yesterday, the object being to protect the public and managers from poor performers and worse dramas. The theaters represented were the Auditorium and Monumental, of Baltimore; Lyceum, Washington; Star, Cleveland; People, Cincinnati; Empire, Indianapolis; Buckingham and Grand opera houses, Louisville; Standard, St. Louis; Academy of Music, Pittsburgh.

Cash for a College. NEW YORK, Feb. 22.—A lady in New York, whose name is for the present withheld, has presented to Bishop John F. Hurst, for the American university at Washington, \$100,000 in cash. It is understood that this is an endowment for the chair of history, which is the first department contemplated by the trustees of the university. A few days ago a gift of equal value was contributed by an Ohio gentleman.
