THE BOARD OF TRADE CEREALS MOVE UP THE SCALE.

PROVISIONS CLOSED LOWER.

Prices Well Supported on the New York Stock Exchange—Bulls Rapidly Absorbed All Offerings and Bears Were Puzzled—London Bought St. Paul in Good-sized Lots.

CHICAGO, March 13.—The wheat market was choppy today within the range and closed 1/4 higher for May. A steady feeling early caused by last night's cash business at the battle shipments. A rally on the clearances was followed by another break on a little selling, and May closed 1/4 higher. May oats 1/4 higher, while provisions closed lower all around.

What was about steady at yesterday's decline when the market opened. It gave some indication of recovery in the first half-hour of the session, but during the half-hour succeeding that it became weaker than ever, and touched at that time 1/4 lower than the lowest price it reached yesterday. The opening price for May was 58 1/2, from which it gradually recovered to 58 3/4, but following that it dropped to 58 1/4. The export clearances from New York were reported about the time the last-named quotation was current, and these caused buyers to predominate for a time with another rally to 58 3/4.

The export receipts for wheat, corn and other grains were reported as follows: Wheat, 1,200,000 bushels; corn, 1,000,000 bushels; other grains, 500,000 bushels.

Notwithstanding reports from the seaboard that there was no sign of export inquiry, 35,000 bushels were worked here, 25,000 bushels of it to go on one day to New York. The market was rather steady at 58 1/2 at the close.

Corn was generally firm and at times quite strong. Commission houses were well supplied with orders by fairly sized parcels. Liverpool was quoted at 14 1/2, and the market was rather firm but inactive. Business here was rather spasmodic, but a good volume was summed up in the course of the day. The opening price for March was 75 1/2, it improved to 75 3/4, and held firmly after that at around 75 1/2.

Oats held firm, but the activity which had been in evidence in the market's principal feature, had fallen off to a small local business. The offerings were quiet, and the market was rather steady at 31 1/2 at the close.

Provisions were generally quiet, with a decrease of 12,000 bushels in the stock of contract oats, and the cause of the retained strength. May opened at 31 1/2, and sold up to 31 3/4. The market weakened slightly before the close, and May was offered at 31 1/2, and sold at that price. July sold at 31 1/2, and closed at 31 1/2.
