NEW YORK, March 22, 1894.—The black watered silk craze still continues, and it is mixed with everything that fashion lays any claim to.

In reality, the tailor-made gowns—or suit, as I suppose it must be called, now that it consists so often of merely a coat and skirt—is a smarter and more individual thing if it is entirely made of cloth. It is the one that sets out to be an entirely tailor gown. But the craze of the moment has crept in, leaped—into everything, and there is not now a single garment of feminine attire that has not some portion made of this apparently fascinating material. We hardly see a rever that is not faced with it, a collar band that is not composed of it, a few that is not made of it, while it is an old story now that many a well-known name has challenged criticism.

IN A HAT OF IT.

At Redferna's they are making vests of it. As a tight-fitting article like this it is not a success as it does not shine as a material for fitting. The prettiest vests of it that I have seen have a colored flower on them and somewhat suggest the broad-cast vests of the earlier days. This material, however, is strictly kept for the vest while the accompanying costume has trimmings of plain more. The new vests which fashion wears beyond our ken are by the latest thing, and they are generally made of horse cloth. Although vests are covered with thick patterns of braiding, and the braided coat is still popular, gowns are trimmed with quantities of braid put on in straight lines. 
gown may well be imagined. This is a smart little leather-colored gown for walking. Buttons will be seen to play an important part. The vest of more here has a double row. The
