



BEST IS TO BE RESTORED.

SO SAYS THE CONFERENCE COMMITTEE OF THE A. R. U.

STILL THERE IS GRIEVANCE.

The A. R. U. of St. Paul Discovers the Reported Interests With Debs in Which He Is Made to Say That Hill Is Living Up to Agreement—Organizer Rogers Here.

Engineer Best is to be reinstated in the service of the Eastern Minnesota railway. This was the intimation given to the A. R. U. committee yesterday afternoon in an indirect way by President Hill. The reason for the reinstatement has not been made, but members of the committee, when last seen last night, said that he and his firm would be back on their engine in a day or two. One cause of grievance against the company will thus be removed; but there are several other matters which the men say must be adjusted before they will be satisfied. They have, they say, positive proof that quite a number of old employees engaged in the recent strike have been discharged in violation of the agreement made with the company, and that new men are working in their places. Some of these discharged men are to be here today, and will meet the committee at a meeting to be held this forenoon in Labor hall, when their cases will be thoroughly discussed.

An executive session of the committee was held yesterday afternoon, but no definite action was taken. Mr. Pillsbury, chairman of the arbitration committee, held a long conference with President Hill in the afternoon, and after Mr. Hill's office to Labor hall, where he had a talk with the men and explained to them the position taken by the company. As a result of his efforts in the direction of peace it is probable that a settlement of all disturbing questions will be effected without another serious outbreak.

Organizer Rogers arrived in the city yesterday and was with the men at their meeting in the afternoon, hearing their statements and offering suggestions. He is here virtually as the representative of Mr. Debs, whose other duties prevent him from coming in person.

When shown the reported interview at Terre Haute with Mr. Debs, in which that gentleman is said to have stated that the company was living up to the agreement, a prominent member of the committee threw some doubt on its genuineness, and said Mr. Debs, if he spoke as reported, had evidently not received the statement of affairs sent to him by the committee, and that his opinion would change when he took it. Correspondence has been passing between Mr. Hill and Mr. Debs, and the Great Northern president appears to be satisfied with what he has heard from the president of the American Railway union.

The regular meetings of the local unions are to be held this evening, and there is some talk of merging them into one joint meeting at Labor hall.

IN A BUSINESS WAY.

A New York Attorney Discusses the Union Pacific Middle.

New York, May 10.—In pursuance of a notice to L. J. Morrison, a member of the New York bar, that the house committee on Pacific railroads would hear a presentation of the views he represented regarding the Union Pacific railroad, that gentleman has sent to the committee a lengthy communication embodying his views, and enclosing a draft for an act entitled "a bill to provide for payment of the United States 6 per cent bonds issued in aid of the Union Pacific and Kansas Pacific railroads, with the proceeds of the government mortgages placed on the railroads for that purpose." He says that the relations between the United States and the Union Pacific railway are treated as a purely business standpoint. His proposition seems to be a reply to the plans of the attorney general and the reorganization committee, and appears to be the first suggestion in favor of sustaining the full claim of the government, it being understood that Mr. Morrison's clients are willing to purchase the government mortgages, and he says that the bill proposes that the government shall realize from its property rights in the railroads the funds necessary for the payment of the United States 6 per cent bonds, with interest, by the secretary of the treasury to assign the government mortgages for the acquisition of the government bonds by the bond and stockholders of the Union Pacific railway company, who are naturally desirous to acquire them and avoid the foreclosure features of the bill, enables the company to issue its bonds, to be secured by assignment of the government mortgages to trustees, the company's bond and stockholders to have the privilege of subscribing to the company's bonds, the total amount receivable being the total amount of net liability of the company, being the principal and interest of the bonds less the sinking fund. Mr. Morrison argues that the property affords to their security a desirable investment, as at 2 per cent on \$50,000,000 only \$1,000,000 would be required for interest, which is less than half the minimum earnings of the property. He also argues that the payment of interest of their own present union securities, or the holders of the bonds could pay themselves 4 per cent on the same amount of new bonds, out of the net earnings of the government divisions.
