WHEAT PLAYED SEE-SAW.

COMING IN AT THE FINISH WITH A GAIN.

HEAVY, IRREGULAR TRADING.

Chicago, May 21.—Wheat went up and down with bewildering alacrity today, closing with a 3/4 cent advance of 1 1/2 and an equal decline.

IN bread there was a heavy trade and broad market, with the prices very irregular. Opening trades were all 1/4 cent advance, and after selling down 1/2 cent.

THE interest in oats centered in September, which was bought freely early, and prices advanced 1/2 cent. The market was very active, and the price of oats advanced 1/2 cent.

LOWER prices at the yard and hog receipts, which in excess of the normal caused a slight decline in values at the opening in provisions. The market soon turned up to near Saturday's closing.

CASH quotations were as follows: Flour unchanged; winter wheat, \$2.40; spring wheat, \$2.35; corn, \$1.10; soybeans, \$1.15; cotton, \$1.10.
