

A FIGHT OVER LANDS

Is On Between the Northern Pacific and the Great Northern Roads.

THE N. P. CLAIMS THE GRANT.

Several Million Acres of Lands Involved in the Contest.

INDICTMENTS HELD VALID.

Strikers Must Stand Trial--Half-Breed Sloan Taken to Stillwater.

A legal fight over the lands claimed by the two transcontinental roads, the Northern Pacific and the Great Northern, is on in the United States circuit court. The fight involves the title to several million acres of land located in Minnesota, besides many miles along the Wisconsin, the Dakota, Montana, Idaho and Washington. They are located within the thirty miles indemnity limits of the Northern Pacific road and the ten miles place limits of the St. Paul, Minneapolis & Manitoba road. A voluminous bill in chancery was filed in the court in this city yesterday. Thomas F. Oakes, Henry C. Payne and Henry C. Rouse, receivers of the Northern Pacific road, are the complainants, and the defendants are the St. Paul, Minneapolis & Manitoba road, John S. Kennedy and James Roosevelt, of New York; R. B. Angus, of Canada, and the Central Trust Company of New York. The bill of complaint sets up the several acts of congress granting lands to the roads in question, the building of the Northern Pacific road; the grant of lands to the roads and the patents issued by the government. The petitioners pray that the state of Minnesota to the St. Paul & Pacific and St. Paul, Minneapolis & Manitoba road be canceled, and that the Northern Pacific road be declared the owner of the lands, which are described by sections. The court is asked to compel the defendants to account for all lands sold by it and for the timber cut off the land. An injunction is asked to prevent the defendants from selling or assigning the lands, and to restrain the state of Minnesota from making deeds of the lands to the defendants. The lands in question are along the lines of the roads in question beginning at a point on Lake Superior opposite the Montreal River, and extending along the lines through Minnesota, Wisconsin, the Dakota, Idaho, and Washington to a point near Portland, Ore., near the mouth of the Walla Walla river, in Washington. The lands in the state of Minnesota are the only ones involved in this suit, but there is no doubt that actions will be prosecuted in the other states simultaneously. The plaintiff asserts that it has entered the lands in this state granted it in pursuance of acts of congress. These entries were made in the land offices of Duluth, Tracy's Falls, St. Cloud and Alexandria, in Minnesota, and at Boyfield, Wis.

INDICTMENTS VALID.

Effort to Quash the Striker Indictments Fails.

A demurrer to five indictments against Great Northern strikers of Breckenridge were argued before Judge Williams of the United States district court, yesterday. The demurrer was under oath and charged with conspiracy and intimidation. The offense was committed on the day the Boen bill was signed providing that the trial of causes shall take place in the division of the district where the offense is alleged to have occurred. This was in other cases to Feigus Falls for trial. Mr. Matthews, attorneys for the defendants, argued that as the indictments were found at the term of court held in St. Paul, in view of the passage of the law the indictments were void because the court had no jurisdiction. Judge Williams held that the law being directory the indictments are good, and that the court has jurisdiction. The demurrers were therefore overruled.

TAKEN TO STILLWATER.

John Sloan, who choked his wife to death, in the United States circuit court for closing his wife to death on the White Earth Indian reservation, was taken to the penitentiary at Stillwater yesterday by Deputy United States Marshal Tallman. Sloan was found guilty last winter. There was a motion for a new trial and an application for a discharge upon a writ of habeas corpus. All of these proceedings went against Sloan and he will serve four years for homicide.

FEDERAL COURT NOTES.

James Conway, the erier in the federal court building, was given a judgment yesterday for \$208 as per diem wages. He has another claim of the same character for \$300. George S. Shaw, of Cloquet, was acquitted upon an indictment charging him with obstructing justice. He was acquitted with a fine of \$100 and a suspended sentence. The case was tried in the United States district court.

INVOKES NELSON'S AID TO RE-INSTATE MEN.

Nelson Says He Will Act Individually, but Not as Governor of the State.

The Twin City Rapid Transit company has generously arranged to give its employees in the two cities a picnic at Willwood, on the shores of White Bear, where the company furnishes transportation both on its own lines and on the White Bear Electric railroad from East Seventh street, to the men and their families. Yesterday the first contingent, numbering nearly 1,000 of the Minneapolis street car men, with their wives, children and friends, came over early in the morning on ten vestibule cars, which were gaily decorated with red, white and blue bunting, and as these pulled up at the end of East Seventh street, the passengers were transferred to the electric train of the White Bear Electric railway company, that were waiting at the terminal. The vestibules were sidetracked at this point until evening, and the appearance that they presented with their tri-colored streamers floating in the breeze was very gay. The company had arranged to give one-half of the Minneapolis employees a holiday yesterday, and the remainder on Wednesday of next week. The same arrangement has been made for the St. Paul men Tuesday and Thursday of next, being the days they have selected. The excursionists brought with them a band and a short programme of sports, with prizes for the winners in the different events, and they went out for a good time, and had it. Expressions of satisfaction with the way the crowd was handled by the railroad company, and also with the attention received from the management at Willwood, were heard on every side, although the day was an extremely hot one. The large amount of shade in the picnic grounds made a delightful place for the midday spread to be prepared. All the boats in the place were in constant use, and the passengers were always a large attraction. A party of about 100 chartered the steamer Maud and spent the greater part of the afternoon on the lake, which was very calm and pleasant for rowing. GREAT CATTLE INFLOW.

Looked for by Gen. Flower, if Time Improves. Gen. Mark D. Flower, president of the St. Paul Union Stockyards company, commenting upon the movement of cattle from the Northwestern ranges yesterday, said: "If the cattle improve soon I look for about 150,000 head from the Northwest this season. Only about 2,500 head of Montana steers have arrived here thus far. During previous seasons the run has been much larger and the corresponding time. Several causes have delayed the movement this year, but the principal one now is the low range of values as compared with last season. It is reported that grass is plentiful in the Montana valleys and that the cattle are in good condition. This being the case, the shippers naturally hold off in the hope that the price of country stock will be higher. Much of the superior stock that has been thrown on the markets on account of the abnormally dry weather. The Northwestern ranges have furnished over 200,000 head last year and distributed several millions of dollars among the stockmen."

PAYING FOR THE PINE.

THE SUITS IN THREE FRAUD CASES SETTLED. \$20,000 Paid by the Itasca and Ackley Lumber Companies--Richardson's Statement.

Gov. Nelson yesterday received a check for \$17,451.04 from Harris Richardson, attorney for the state in the suits brought against the Itasca and A. Ackley Lumber companies, this being the amount collected from the companies for lumber cut by them in excess of the amount reported to the state.
