BAD BOYS SENTENCED.

Gang of Young Thieves Get Thirty Days Each for Vagrancy.

Nearly two hours of time were consumed yesterday morning in Judge Twoly's court to tell what was already an old story to the court and police department, namely, that a lot of young toughs who were rounded up by the officers a few days ago were as bad as they could possibly be. It developed during the hearing that the boys had long ago been ostracized even from their own homes, and that they are a set of young thieves. The particular charge at this time was vagrancy. Despite a vigorous defense by Edward Darragh, Judge Twoly concluded that the entire lot should go to the workhouse for the next thirty days. In pronouncing sentence the judge gave them a severe lecture.
