

DIRECTUM FAILED. His Go at the Two-Year-Old Record Was Not a Success.

GENTRY DID FAST WORK. Three Heats the Best Yet Trotted at the Chicago Meet.

FAVORITES LOOMED UP. Numerously at Saratoga--Exciting Finishes on the Jerome Park Track.

CHICAGO, Aug. 23.—In a trial today against time Directum did no better than 2:30.75, yet the track and weather were the best for record breaking of the week. It was warmer. Some think there is something wrong with the track, although horsemen are divided as to whether the owners of the horse are merely reserving him or whether he is not up to his last year's speed. He was given two warnings up before his formal trial today, and in one of these was credited with going in 2:28.5, a figure that the official timers refused to confirm. The last quarter was said to be in 29.75.

The chief feature today was the victory of John R. Gentry in the 2:08 pace in straight heats. The time was the fastest of the meeting—2:07.4, 2:07.4, 2:08. For the opening heat Hal Braden was an almost prohibitive favorite, 5 to 1 being the best the books would offer. One bookmaker held him out and put up 10 against each of the others, paying out a small fortune on Gentry. The latter paced beautifully and won easily.

DEAD HEAT AT JEROME. Several Exciting Finishes in Yesterday's Events. New York, Aug. 23.—The attendance was light at Jerome Park today, but there was more or less excitement over three very close finishes. The first was in the two-year-old handicap, in which Sir Dixon Jr. won from Cockade by a short head, with Utica a short distance back.

The next was in the fifth race, for two-year-olds, when Taylor and Doggett rode Albert A. and Midstar. They had a hard drive at the way through the stretch, and so close were they at the finish that the judges could not separate them, and a dead heat was announced. In the run-off Midstar won. The sixth race was also a tight fit, and Berceux and K. Doggett fought out the last eighth of a mile on Adellbert and Terapin, with whip and spur, and Berceux finally won by sheer force. SARATOGA FAVORITES. Capture Four Out of Six of the Events. SARATOGA, Aug. 23.—Four out of six favorites were successful today. Jockey Perkins rode the winning horse in every race but one. The Cedar Hill stable's Bart was held in the highest speculation estimate for the five furlong dash. Four youngsters came to the post, and the favorite brought home the money by over two good lengths, having led from start to finish. Five starters faced the flag in the mile and a sixteenth race, and Seaman's Victorious was thought a fraction the best of in the bet. The favorite looked like a winner till almost at home when Fleischmann's Lehman, a third choice, came forward suddenly and upset the gelding out by a head. Walbaum's Victoria carried most of the money in the dash of a five and one-half furlongs, for the California stable, a two-year-old event, but only secured third place. Hearton made a good showing up when to the last furlong when Pepper's Neceda came up, and won by a half length over Rossmore, and was the last to cross the wire. JOCKEY WANTS HIS CASH. A Big Suit Begun Against Horsemen on Monday. New York, Aug. 23.—Justice Heald, of the supreme court, has appointed William Lamey guardian of his son, Jockey James Lamey, in order to bring action against William C. Daly, the turfman, to recover \$10,000 for jockey services from January, 1887, to last February. The boy was apprenticed to Daly years ago, and last year ran away because of the latter's alleged ill-treatment. Lamey, who is now eighteen years old, tried to get a license from the board of control, but they refused, and he was unable to ride this season. They declined to issue a license until the case passed upon the allegation that Daly had violated the articles of apprenticeship.

ANOTHER SURPRISE. Thayer Defeats Estes in a Close Game. Thayer, the better one-wielder, met Howard Estes, the billiard impresario of the Windsor, at Foley's last night in a straight-rail game, and, though it required seventy-five innings for him to defeat Estes, he finally did. To judge by the final score it was a close contest, the card showing Thayer 300, Estes 296. In this respect, it was nearly as close as the contest the night previous, between Saunpson and Dickinson. Thayer was handicapped at 250 points and Estes at 188. Thayer did not really make up his mind to do business till the eleventh inning, when he ran 11. He took it remarkably easy up to that point and after as well for several innings, when he showed up suddenly with 21. He did not hurry himself any after that until he reached the twenty-eighth inning, when he made 13. Estes up to this time had not scored a single double, but Howard concluded, in his thirtieth inning, to run 12, and he did it. Thayer evidently had a penchant for double figures of odd denominations, as he made another 13 in his thirty-fourth turn at the c. Estes, in his thirty-fifth inning, wanted 10 to get to 300, but he failed to do so. The actual number of points made by Thayer were 250; by Estes, 176. The credited averages were: Thayer, 2; Estes, 4. In this they were even. As to actual averages, Thayer made 3%, and Estes 2 1/4%.

Tonight Thomas will play Carney. Perhaps another surprise is in store. VIGILANT BADLY INJURED. Some of the Plates Must Come Off for Repairs. SOUTHAMPTON, Aug. 23.—George Gould has requested J. Harvard Biles, professor of naval architecture at the University of Glasgow, to make a special survey of the Vigilant for the purpose of proving the falsity of the rumors circulated at Cowes regarding the recent accident to that yacht's center board. The survey will probably result in showing it to be necessary to remove one or two of the Vigilant's plates in order to ascertain the extent of the damage to her center board slot. This morning workmen began cutting out a portion of the lead keel with the object of removing the broken center board pivot hook which formed the board's axis. The board is being leveled, and its connecting chains and shackles are being repaired. The work will probably occupy five days.

Lonsdale Will Challenge. LONDON, Aug. 23.—The Yachtsman says that it learns, upon good authority, that the next challenge for the America's cup will be issued by the Earl of Lonsdale. Vandy Fair today says that the Earl of Lonsdale has offered to be greatly annoyed at the failure on Saturday last to sail the match race between Britannia and Vigilant. He adds that when Mr. Gould boarded the royal yacht Osborne in order to explain matters, the Prince of Wales remarked that he was irritated over "Lonsdale's" about center-board; "I know nothing about them."

Kaiser's New Yacht. BERLIN, Aug. 23.—Emperor William has placed an order with G. L. Watson, the Clyde yacht designer, for plans for a motor yacht. The boat, it is understood, will be built in Germany in time to take part in the Cowes regatta next year.

Britannia's Day. WYMOUTH, Aug. 23.—In a race under the auspices of the Royal Dorset Yacht club today, the Britannia defeated the Satanita by 1 1/2 minutes. The course was from Cowes to Weymouth.

MATCH FOR DIXON. Australian Featherweight Will Fight Him. NEW YORK, Aug. 23.—George Dixon and Jerry Marshall, who claims to be featherweight champion of Australia, were matched today to fight to a finish for the world's featherweight championship of the world. Tom O'Rourke, Dixon's manager, posted \$1,000, while Mike Haley, on behalf of Marshall, has deposited a like sum. No special date for the mill was agreed upon, but both sides consented to any reasonable purse offered by the Olympic club of New Orleans, or the Seaside club, or Coney island.

ANOTHER BLUFF CALLED. An "Offer" From the Southwest for the Corbett-Jackson Fight. PAISONS, Kan., Aug. 23.—A purse of \$25,000 has been offered by the Kansas, Indian territory and Texas citizens for the Jackson-Corbett fight, to take place at Wagner, I. T., where there are no laws to prevent such a contest. Richard K. Fox tonight telegraphed Jackson's manager, J. E. "Evelyn" Smith, offering providing the money was deposited in New York. The money was guaranteed tonight, and it is said it would be forwarded Monday.

Knock-Out in Three Rounds. MOUNT CLEMENS, Mich., Aug. 23.—Ed Austin, of Detroit, was knocked out by Tom Kelly, of New York, in a glow contest held in the opera house here tonight. The fight was to have been ten rounds, but Kelly had won the rats receipts easily when the third round was finished.

Says It Will Come Off. At Harrington, of Sioux City, was in Minneapolis yesterday. He says the offer for the Corbett-Jackson fight is made in good faith and that the affair will probably be brought off, one of the islands in the Missouri river.
