the only consideration it would not pay to grow sheep now, but if grown for wool and mutton sheep property would prove a paying investment.

He spoke of the lack of foresight shown by those who are selling their flocks and trying to get rid of their sheep as quickly as possible.

In his opinion the sheep was not for distant sale, but a larger number of persons would be desirous of buying sheep, and they would in all probability have to pay high prices to get them.

Breeding sheep is a carefully preserved, as no other kind of stock would be better return for the money invested if the business was properly managed.

Mr. McKerron answered a great many questions, bearing on the different phases of sheep husbandry.

He thought that the wool trade was carried on in exporting sheep to Great Britain in the winter season.

The animals most suited for such a trade would be shearings of good size and form.

He thought that when Wisconsin farmers came into Minnesota and bought breeding flocks from Minnesota farmers, who were anxious to sell, and then brought Minnesota grain to feed them, the Wisconsin farmers had the best of the deal.

In his judgment the breed was better in a matter of wool than the individuality of the animal.
