OTHER SENATE DOINGS.

Sheehan Introduced a Bill to Repeal the Water Frontage Tax.

KELLER CARRIES A POINT.

His Baking Powder and Pure Condiment Bills Acted Upon Favorably.

The senate held an all-day session yesterday and cleared up the secretary's desk.

Senator Sheehan introduced a bill to establish an "interstate park of the Dalles of the St. Croix."

Senator Keller introduced a bill proposing an amendment to section 2, article 9, of the constitution so as to make provision for taxing all property not exempt by the laws of the United States.

Senator Greer's bill to allow applicants for teachers' certificates to appeal from the county superintendent to the state superintendent of public instruction, was recommended to pass.

Senator Sheehan's bill to amend the constitution so as to allow cities to make their own charters was reported back from the committee on municipal corporations without recommendation, and was referred to the committee of the whole.

Senator Young introduced a resolution to recall from the judiciary committee the bill to forfeit the land grant to the Hastings & Dakota Railroad company.

Senator Howard introduced two bills, which provided that appeals to the supreme court shall be taken upon original papers and not upon a transcript of the record, and to leave out questions and answers in evidence, but to use the narrative form.

Senator Stevens introduced a bill to authorize the sale of the state capital lands in Kandiyohi county, in such pieces and parcels and upon such terms as the land commissioner, the governor and chief justice of the supreme court may agree.

Senator Sheehan introduced a bill to repeal the water frontage tax law. S. F. 541 was introduced as a substitute for S. F. 121, and provides for preventing banks from declaring a dividend until after the nominal capital stock is paid up.

Senator Spencer introduced S. F. 525 to limit a day's work to ten hours, to amend chapter 24 of the Statutes of 1878 to that effect. Any foreman, overseer or employer violating the provision shall be fined from \$10 to \$50.

Senator Stevens introduced a bill to regulate and define the powers of boards of park commissioners. In addition to the power to regulate the right to make a frontage assessment is conferred by the bill.

Senator Sheehan introduced a bill to amend chapter 24 of the Statutes of 1878 to that effect. Any foreman, overseer or employer violating the provision shall be fined from \$10 to \$50.
