BRILLIANT NIGHTS.

WILL SOON BE PLACED IN THE BUSINESS CENTERS OF THE CITY.

At last the business streets of the city of St. Paul are to be lighted after dark.

The board passed a resolution, introduced by Ald. Brady, which instructs the St. Paul Gas Light company to place arc lights of 2,000 candle power at every street crossing on the following streets:

Fourth street, from Jackson street to Seven corners; Fifth and Sixth streets, from Jackson street to Seventh street, and Washburn and St. Peter streets, from Third street to Cornhill.

The resolution also instructs the gas company to discontinue all the gas lamps on those streets between the points named, and likewise such gas lamps on the intersecting streets as may be dispensed with.

The board also adopted the resolution recommending the city engineer, the city, as it will dispense with several hundred gas lamps.

The electric lights are to be in operation from sunset to sunrise, and will cost the city \$150 per lamp per year.

The board also confirmed a contract with the St. Paul Gas Light company for placing and maintaining electric arc lights at all the intersections of Seventh street from Seven corners to the city limits, and providing for a discontinuance of all the gas lamps between those points.

The resolution authorizing this contract was introduced into the assembly by Mr. Arosin, and there- in adopted.

By the terms of the contract, the city is to pay two-thirds of the expense of erecting or placing the arc lights at each crossing, which two-thirds will amount to \$10 per lamp, the gas company consenting to pay the remaining \$5.

The saving to the city on Seventh street amounts to at least \$2,500 a year. The terms of this contract are also to govern the placing of the electric lights on Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Washburn and St. Peter streets, and the work is to be completed by Sept. 15.

The board also adopted the resolution recommending the board of public works which provides for an all-night service of the arc lights stationed in the parks, about the market house and in the masts, and which will effect a saving of ninety-five gas lamps in the vicinity of these arc lights.

This will effect another saving of \$2,300 a year.

CITY DOG CATCHER.

The city of St. Paul may sometime have on its list of officials a dog catcher—not that St. Paul has a dog catcher, but that the ordinance which has succeeded in passing both bodies of the council during the past three months.

The grounds for the veto were stated in an accompanying message, in which his honor demonstrated that the ordinance was impracticable. The mayor declared that in his opinion it would be impossible for a man to construct a dog pound as required, furnish food for and maintain the dogs for ten days and employ men and teams to gather in the dogs, and meet all this expense upon the basis of compensation specified in the ordinance, which was to allow the dog catcher 25 cents for every dog license fee collected by him, and 10 cents for every dog he drove.

The language used by the mayor for every license collected by him would not necessarily insure the dog catcher any revenue from the dog pound in case the owners of impounded dogs chose to obtain the license and pay the fine.

The mayor's objection in short was that the compensation provided was inadequate.

Upon motion of Ald. Markham the vote by which the ordinance was passed was reconsidered. Then following a debate between Ald. Markham and Murphy as to the merits of the ordinance, Ald. Markham said he did not agree with the mayor that 25 cents for each dog license fee was inadequate compensation.

Ald. Murphy explained that the city attorney had expressed the opinion that the dog catcher could not collect a cent for licenses issued at the city clerk's office.

Ald. Murphy then moved that the veto stand sustained, and such was the decision of the board by a vote of 10 to 1. Ald. Markham voting "no."

THE SCHOOL BUDGET.

The board concurred with the assembly in passing without alteration the ordinance providing the school budget for the school year 1896-1897.

The whole amount asked for and allowed is \$172,250. Ald. Hare voted for the ordinance, but in giving his reasons therefor, said that he was under compulsion, as he was opposed to allowing the \$85,000 for additional teachers.

Ald. Brady preliminary orders were passed for the paying of the following small triangular portions left by the paying of Fifth, Sixth, Seventh and St. Peter streets, from West Sixth to West Seventh street; Exchange street, from West Fifth street to West Sixth street; and from West Sixth to West Seventh street; and from West Sixth to West Seventh street.

The contract between the city and the Great Northern Railroad company, whereby the latter agreed to pay one-third of the cost of the extension bridge, was finally approved.
