SENATE FOREIGN AFFAIRS COMMITTEE REPORTS A SUBSTITUTE CUBAN RESOLUTION.

ENTIRE CHANGE OF FRONT.

ACCORDS RECOGNITION OF BELIGERENCY AND DECLARES OUR NEUTRALITY.

DAVIS REPORT FROM HAVANA Says That Cubans Are Disgusted Over the Failure of the Hawkins Expedition.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—The senate committee on foreign relations today agreed upon a substitute for the resolution heretofore reported on the question of the recognition of Cuba, and authorized Senator Morgan to report it to the senate.

Resolved, by the senate, the house representatives concurring, that, in the opinion of congress, a condition of public war exists between the government of Spain and the government proclaimed and for some time maintained by force of arms by the people of Cuba.

The committee also voted to make an effort to take up the Cuban question in the senate as soon as the urgent deficiency bill and the resolution for the distribution of the appropriation bills can be disposed of.

The action of the committee upon the resolution as finally agreed upon was unanimous, with the exception of Senator Cameron, who announced his adherence to his position looking to the formal recognition of the independence of Cuba.

There was an effort in the committee to have the resolution put in such shape as to have whatever action should be taken by this country, be executed by the president, but the suggestion was over-ruled on the theory that congress should act independently, leaving the executive to pursue whatever course he might deem proper.
