ANOKA HAS ITS GOIN AUDITOR BROWN DRAWS THE LONG-DELAYED WARRANT AND IT IS PAID.

SAY THEY WILL AID HASTINGS By Any Means in Their Power to Secure the Next Plum It May Seek.

Anoka is \$15,000 richer today than it was yesterday. John S. Woodbury yesterday drew from the state treasury his cash for the site selected by the state commissioners for the fourth Minnesota insane hospital.

The deed was done yesterday afternoon at 4:30 and the sun, which was slowly sinking in the western sky, reflected through the clean windows of the capitol the beatific smile that o'erspread all faces in Anoka.

"We've got 'em now," was the concise way in which the Anoka contingent sized up the situation. The money was paid, and if the Hastings people now have any recourse, the Anokans fall to see it. They admit that it might be possible for the Hastings people to nurse their wrath and oppose the future appropriations for the building itself. But, as Editor Pease, who came in a few minutes after the thing was done, naively remarked: "They will not do that. We will show them how magnanimous we can be. If Hastings comes before the people of the state as a bidder for any of the state institutions, we will be their most enthusiastic supporters.

There were few formalities to be observed. Mr. Woodbury, with a small party of Anoka citizens, and Harris Richardson, the attorney for the majority of the commission, visited the capitol early in the afternoon, bearing with them the abstracts, which the auditor in a few minutes submitted to Attorney General Childs. The latter stated that the irregularities which had been objected to by him had been straightened out, and within three minutes from the time that the auditor the attorney general's private office Mr. Woodbury was on his way to the treasurer's office with a warrant for \$15,000 in his hand.
