DULL STOCK WEEK

SAGGING TENDENCY AND MATERIAL CONCESSIONS WERE THE MAIN FEATURES.

LONDON WAS A SELLER.

IN THE MAIN ITS ACTION DID NOT HAVE MATERIAL EFFECT.

CHOICE INVESTMENT SECURITIES.

Inquiry for Them Was Noted in New York, and at Considerably Improved Figures.

NEW YORK, May 30.—In the stock market this week there was no reflection of the cheerful temper which characterized the dealings of the week previous. Speculation presented a dull and sagging tendency, and eventual material concessions occurred in a number of shares.

London did not figure extensively in the market, but with a steady selling of the leading shares. Realizing incident advances of the previous week gave the initial impetus to the downward drift. The gold export movement maintained its unusual prominence as an unfavorable factor, and in a number of instances the traffic returns of railroads reported were disappointing, including those of the St. Paul, Burlington, Reading and New Jersey Central. The decrease in the east-bound tonnage statistics also had a dampening effect, although the latter exhibits showed some improvement. The speculation was continuously in professional control, and special efforts were discernible to shake out long stocks. Liquidation sales were evident in some instances. There was some inquiry for choice investment securities, and transactions were noted at materially improved figures. The bears displayed activity in putting out lines of shorts in closing deals, and the offerings were increased after the news of the St. Louis disaster. The railway shares figured prominently in the market, owing to the more general pressure against the list in connection with foreign selling and the depression of the gold market. There was the great damage to property from the Southwestern tornado. In general, the selling pressure was exhausted on Thursday, and a buying movement for both accounts set in under the influence of light closing reports that had been anticipated and the legal victory of the joint traffic association.
