Programme of Events at the State Fair Grounds.

A bicycle meeting will be held at the State Fair grounds Saturday afternoon under the auspices of the Minnesota Driving Club.

Special attention has been given to the track, which is being put in first-class shape, so that new records may be made.

If there is sufficient time a special race will be run of riders against a 2:15 trotting horse, for which special prizes will be awarded.
