KEEP OFF THE LAWN

SUMMIT AVENUE RESIDENTS OBJECT TO THE PROPOSED STREET DECORATIONS FOR THE ENCAMPMENT WEEK. THEY DELAY THE WORK AND SCARE THE ARRANGEMENT COMMITTEE BADLY.

PROSPECT IS NOW FOR PEACE. Secretary Finney Visits the Objectors and Succeeds in Pacifying Them, at Least in Part.

The citizens' G. A. R. committee met with an unexpected setback yesterday which threatens to interfere with one of the most important features of the encampment. The obstacle arose in the form of a refusal of the property holders on Summit avenue to allow the erection of poles in front of their premises for the purpose of illuminating the avenue on the evenings when it is proposed to hold the several outdoor receptions which have been arranged for by the general committee and announced as a part of the official programme.

At the last meetings of the respective branches of the common council a resolution was passed granting permission to the G. A. R. committee for the closing of Summit avenue on specified dates, from Summit park to West-ern avenue, and for the erection of the poles in question. The uprisings were to be twenty-eight in number and placed in ten-inch holes on the boulevards just inside of the curbing. The committee was obligated to work at its own expense and to remove the poles and put the grounds in condition after the encampment.

There was some opposition to the resolution when it was brought before the council, but none of an open nature, and it passed both bodies unanimously.

Yesterday morning Contractor Nelson, to whom had been awarded the work of erecting the poles, appeared on the scene of his labors with a crew of men and began operations. He got no further, however, than a brief survey of the situation when he was told by several property owners that the poles could not be put up in front of their premises.

The contractor was not prepared to let the erection of the poles be delayed, and he promptly visited the city hall, where he apprised Mayor Doran of the situation and asked for instructions as to whether or not he should go ahead with his work. He did not have the names of any of those who had objected to the pole-raising project, but he gave him a note to whom it may concern, stating that the work was being done according to law and that he had a perfect right to complete his contract.

In the meantime the officials at G. A. R. headquarters had been apprised of the situation, and while somewhat chagrined at the turn of events, they had taken the matter into their own hands and started out to find the objectors with a view to securing an amicable settlement of the difficulty. Several property owners were seen and stated their reasons for opposing the erection of the poles to be on account of the damage which would result to the lawns of the boulevards by being cut up and dug into in order to set the poles. It was explained to these parties that the poles would be set in concrete, and that the intentions of the committee to injure the lawns and the fact pointed out that a ten-inch pole auger, which would make only a small cut, would be used in the work to avoid the anticipated injury. The explanation failed to satisfy the objectors and they also stated that, though they were the ones waited upon by the committee, they were among those who were equally opposed to allowing the poles to go in front of their residences. It is not the desire of the committee to antagonize the Summit avenue property holders, and as but few of those said to object to the plans for the evening receptions could be found yesterday, it was decided to let the matter rest until all parties concerned could be consulted.

With a view, however, to ascertain the consensus of opinion Secretary Finney, of the citizens' committee, visited the residence of Judge Thomas Moran last evening, and as a result of his explanations of the situation as it really exists and the general feeling he found among the property holders, it was decided to attempt in every possible manner, it appears that the entire matter has resolved itself into a misunderstanding rather than a concentrated effort on the part of the Summit avenue people to oppose one of the most attractive features of the encampment.

The idea prevalent on the avenue was that it was the purpose of the committee to erect a string of rough, unsightly poles for which purpose it would be necessary to tear up the sod and generally disfigure the lawn of the boulevard. To dissipate this conception it was only necessary to show how erroneous had been the information of those who objected to the erection of the poles, and to that extent the erection of the poles surmounted with electric lights would really heighten the beauty of the avenue on the occasion in question. The poles will be set 100 feet apart on either side of the street, and instead of being mere barren sticks will be shapely staffs artistically wound from top to bottom with a decorative design. On the top of each pole there will be an arrangement of American flags in clusters so that none of the bare wood will be visible. The contract under which Mr. Nelson performs the work, specifically states that the poles shall be removed the Monday after encampment week, and that the grounds shall be placed in just the exact condition they were in before the receptions were held. Furthermore, Mr. Nelson is an experienced hand at just the style of work which is being done, having been engaged in the care of lawns and the transplanting of trees for years, so that it is highly improbable that he will allow his workmen to engage in methods which in any way injure the boulevards beyond the cutting away of the necessary ten inches of sod for the purpose of starting the post holes.

When Secretary Finney made the above statement to those who were said to be in opposition to the erection of the poles, he found the sentiment generally favorable to allowing the poles to be put up. Some of the avenue residents, however, thought that the trees along the boulevards might be utilized instead of putting up poles, and told Secretary Finney that they would be employed in the work, but they were not permitted to put up cross bars or any other attachments which might be thought necessary. It is hardly probable, though, that any method would be employed which would allow of the lights being suspended in the center of the street, and this is not in accordance with the plan of the committee. It is desired that the illumination by electricity shall assist in a display of the handsome residences on the avenue and this end can best be subserved by having the lights on the boulevards.

One of the property owners who was strongest in opposition to the pole rais-

ing, was wholly mollified by being shown that it was not proposed to erect a pole in front of his residence, but that the arrangement placed the one to which he objected in front of a vacant lot next to his premises. Among those visited by Secretary Finney were Richard Gordon, Gen. J. H. Allen, Gen. Bend, Thomas Scott and A. E. Sticker, each of whom stated that if the poles were necessary to the success of the proposed entertainments, there would be no further objection on the part of his premises. The committee is well satisfied over the amicable settlement of the matter, but felt all the time that it had been given right by the city to which it was fully entitled, and for the securing of which it was prepared to put forth considerable effort.

Residents of the First ward interested in the entertainment of old soldiers during the encampment met in the hall at Payne avenue and Wells street last night in large numbers and listened to addresses by Capt.
