STILLWATER MAN MAKES AN ATTEMPT TO KILL HIS DIVORCED WIFE.

WOMAN'S INJURIES SERIOUS.

SHE MAY LOSE AN ARM AS A RESULT OF A BULLET THROUGH THE BONE.

ASSAULT NEARLY LYNCHED.

Safely Lodged in Jail—Republican Name Congressional Delegates—Stillwater News.

Andrew Swanson, marble cutter employed by P. N. Peterson, made an attempt yesterday to murder his divorced wife by firing five shots at her from a thirty-eight caliber revolver.

The shooting occurred on North Second street, Stillwater, and Swanson narrowly escaped lynching, an infuriated crowd endeavoring to take him from Officer Becker.

Swanson, it seems, married his wife in Sweden three years ago, and a year ago furnished her money with which to come to this country.

When she arrived she refused to live with him, and a few months ago went to Fargo, N. D., where she secured a divorce.

She returned to Stillwater Thursday, and last evening called at N. O. Berg's confectionery store.

Swanson watched her while there, and when she came out he followed her. He overtook her on North Second street and immediately opened fire.

One bullet shattered the bone of her right arm between the elbow and another grazed her left leg, producing only a flesh wound.

Five shots were fired in all. The woman sought shelter from her pursuer in the Williams house.

Swanson was apprehended and the jail was searched. His pockets contained \$40 in money and several rounds of cartridges.

He intended killing the woman, and was evidently sorry he didn't. She was taken to the city hospital, and the doctors fear she will lose her arm.
