THE SCHOOL BOARD TO TRY AND FORCE A STATEMENT FROM McCARDY.

WANT TO KNOW CERTAIN FACTS

WHICH HE SAYS HE HAS FURNISHED AND THE BOARD SAYS NOT.

PROCEEDINGS TO BE BEGUN

The Monday After the Encampment Closes Unless He Comes Up With the Information Desired.

In view of the fact that Comptroller McCurdy will be very busy next week with Grand Army affairs the board of school inspectors with commendable tact and consideration yesterday decided they would give the city official until Monday, Sept. 7, to consider their demands for a complete and itemized statement of the funds in his hands belonging to the school board.

This belated decision was reached at a meeting of the school board held yesterday afternoon. All the inspectors were present except Mr. McNair.

Inspector Scholle set the machinery in motion by offering a resolution setting forth the fact that he, as chairman of the finance committee of the board, had been unable to secure a statement from the city comptroller itemizing the school funds in the comptroller's possession.

In fact, Mr. Scholle said, in speaking to his resolution, the school board had been grossly ignored through him, for the comptroller had treated him with contumely and disrespect in refusing to comply with this just and reasonable demand.

pressing the matter and secured the passage of a resolution. He, like Mr. Scholle, thought the city comptroller was holding his head too high, and the only way to bring him to terms was to have the law on him or words to that effect.

Inspector McNair told the board members that they were barking up the wrong stump. Other words they were going about the matter in the wrong way, if they really wished to obtain certain information from the comptroller. He expressed the resolution and voted against it. All other members of the board thought the resolution a good thing and pushed it along with a unanimous vote.

This trouble has been brewing in the board for a long time. At a recent meeting it was suggested that mandamus proceedings be taken, but the suggestion was made in the way of a joke. But Mr. Scholle, as chairman of the finance committee, was unable, he says, to secure information from the comptroller's office.

In fact, Mr. Scholle thinks he has been treated discourteously. One of the chief differences between the board and Mr. McCurdy is the ownership of a certain fund known as the rental and repair fund, about which there was so much discussion when the question of insuring and making changes in school buildings for encampment purposes came up.

The school board insists that this is a general asset of the city, and does not belong to the school board. The comptroller says they already have, and if they understand their duties they need not apply to him for a statement of their resources. If the comptroller keeps their accounts, then, says the comptroller, that is a different proposition.

It is safe to say the comptroller will not heed the demands of the board until compelled to do so by the mandamus proceedings threatened by the board. By the time the Army encampment has cooled down, and the school board once more gets possession of its buildings in good condition, it may be that there will be an amicable arrangement of the present existing differences.

Bible Students Drink From the Well of Life.

FRATERNITY AND CHARITY

Are Expounded by the Head Officers of the Order, Local and National.

The Modern Woodmen had a great time of it last night. The St. Paul camps combined and received a score of head officers of the order and gave them a royal welcome.

The evening was started off with a parade of the members of the order, and the officials in carriages. The marching members were arrayed in Woodmen's garb, and each carried a big ax, but that is no sign they are "knockers." The ax is their badge of membership. One of the camps has a novel uniform. It consists of red shirts, corduroy trousers and top boots. The addition of helmets and an old horse cart would transfer the camp into an old-fashioned volunteer fire company. Headed by a band, the Woodmen paraded a number of the downtown streets. Mayor Doran occupied one of the carriages. The mayor is a modest man and does not like an open carriage with a string of torch bearers on either side. But he thought it good practice for next week, and let the driver take him along the whole line of march.

At the conclusion of the tramp of the kindling wood choppers, there came off the great pow-wow in Market hall. It was in the nature of a family gathering. There were perhaps 800 people of diversified periods of existence. It is one of the cardinal principles of the Woodmen that there shall be real democracy at the doings of the order, democracy which shall be 100 per cent pure. Consequently, when the babies got to playing tag in the aisles, no one was surprised.

Among the big axmen present were Gen. J. N. Reece, of Springfield, chairman of the board of directors; Hon. J. W. White, Hon. A. R. Talbot, of Lincoln, Neb.; Hon. Marvin Quackenbush, member of the board; J. G. Johnson, general attorney for the order; Maj. C. H. Hawes, of Fulton, chief clerk to the board; Ben. J. Smith, Mankato, head adviser; N. A. O. Faulkner, Lincoln, head physician; A. S. Schusman, St. Paul, deputy state comptroller; W. H. Dawson, Slayton, Minn., head of the fourteenth division; and deputy consultants from other points.
