

ALL LINES AGREED

NEW TRANSCONTINENTAL RATES WILL GO INTO EFFECT DEC. 1. SLAP AT SOUTHERN PACIFIC. IMPORTANT EXCURSION BUSINESS TO COME THROUGH ST. PAUL.

MORE RATE CUTTING IS CHARGED. New Rule Regarding Insurance of Passes Affects Freight Men.

On Dec. 1 there will go into effect some new transcontinental rates, applicable from Eastern Canadian points to British Columbia and points on the American Pacific coast.

The meeting which fixed the new rates was a logical sequel to the first transcontinental meeting held last month, which established new rates Nov. 15.

The latter applied from points on the Atlantic seaboard in the United States to British Columbia and North Pacific points, and the rates which will go into effect December will apply to the same territory from Eastern Canada points.

The rates were fixed by representatives of the Canadian Pacific, Northern Pacific, Great Northern, Grand Trunk, and Soo lines. The rates which will apply from Atlantic and Eastern Canada points to North Pacific terminals will show a reduction under those now in effect.

By the terms of the agreement, the Canadian and the American roads in the Northern Pacific territory will be placed on an even basis.

On Tuesday night the Chicago lines secured all the business of prospective passengers aboard Atlantic liners. This looked suspicious to coming roads.
