PARIS, Feb. 20.—The students continued their evening demonstrations in favor of Crete, but without effect. In front of the two thousand people met at Mont Martre and adopted a resolution of Crete's independence. Speeches were made by several members of the chamber of deputies. The French policy of inertia was condemned.

Victory for Britannia.

MAINSVILLE, Feb. 20.—The Mediterranean yacht racing season was inaugurated here with rain falling and a haze hanging over the water. Alisa, Britannia and Samphire and several others started in a twenty-four mile handicap race for three prizes, presented by the president of the republic, open to all yachts above ten tons. The yacht sailed away at 11 o'clock. The course was three times round to complete the total distance. The result was a victory for Britannia. Alisa was second and Samphire third.
