

FIRE'S TARDY VISIT

FIRST ALARM IN A WEEK MARKS A PROPERTY LOSS OF \$10,000.

FURNITURE STOCK SINGED

IN AN EARLY MONDAY BLAZE IN THE COMMISSION COMPANY'S STORE.

LIEUT. MURPHY'S CLOSE CALL

One Fireman is Imprisoned in the Dense Smoke and Narrowly Escapes Asphyxiation.

The first fire alarm for one week called out the fire department shortly after 1 o'clock this morning, when the rear of the building occupied by the Commission Furniture & Carpet company, 137-142 Sixth street, was discovered to be in flames.

Lieut. John Murphy, of Hook and Ladder Company No. 1, had a narrow escape from death by suffocation during the fire. He entered the second story of the building from a rear window, and losing his way in the dense smoke, fell unconscious to the floor.

The fire started in a repair room in the rear of the third floor, where stoves and furniture are renovated, and it is thought may have been caused by exposed gasoline, though how the material was ignited, if such is the case, is unknown.

The fire smoldered to a great extent at first, and it was not thought that it would be of a serious nature, but when the flames broke from the windows and were seen to be spreading to other parts of the building, Chief Jackson ordered a second alarm, calling out additional apparatus, the location of the burning building in the midst of a business district and its close proximity to the Hotel Ryan rendering every precaution necessary.

The building is the property of the Senbury Bishop, of Fairbault. William Dawson, president of the board of directors, but Stephen Jewett, treasurer, has been looking after it lately. The loss on the building is estimated at \$8,000.
