KILLED BY SCORCHER

ANGUS ANDERSON THE VICTIM OF AN INHUMAN AND COWARDLY BICYCLIST.

COLLISION WAS TERRIFIC. ANDERSON BEING THROWN MANY FEET AND HIS SKULL CRUSHED.

SCORCHER GETS A HARD FALL. But Without Waiting to Aid His Victim, He Mounts and Rides Away.

Angus Anderson, a sober, industrious young man, employed in the flour mills, residing at 1906 Fifteenth avenue south, was run down and fatally injured by a cowardly scorcher while on his way to work at 6:30 o'clock Sunday morning.

The coroner has not yet been notified, although Anderson and Moe, undertakers, have the body. So far as known, the scorching man was killed by a reckless rider in this city.

Although he must have realized that his victim was badly hurt, the scorching man kept on his way, leaving scarcely a clue as to his identity. He was seen, however, and as accurate a description of him as possible under the circumstances will probably be furnished the police today.

The accident happened at the West end of the Tenth avenue south bridge. Anderson was passing the approach to the bridge on First street, with his dinner pail on his arm. He was hurrying to his work with his thoughts intent on but one thing—to get there on time.

He had absolutely no warning of the swift yet stealthy approach of the scorching man, who had darted across the length of the bridge but a moment before.

The fellow's head was bent low over his wheel and he was bending his energy to speed, however, for with his starting point and his destination as soon as possible. He was annihilating space and had no thought nor care for human life or limb.

The scorching man, who was riding a wheel scorching Anderson was terrific. It was sufficient to hurl the unfortunate man clear off the street to the side walk. As he fell, severely injured, he struck his head against the base of a lamp post, fracturing the base of the skull and insuring death.

Anderson was thrown many feet and his skull crushed. The wheel tumbled over and over and the rider sprawled at full length on the ground. He must have been painfully injured. When he tried to get up and regained his mount a pronounced limp was noticeable.

His injury did not interfere with his ability to speed, however, for with his victim lying unconscious in the throes of death the rays from the light streaming over his pale face, he rode away almost as rapidly as he had approached.
