KOOTENAI FEELS IT

KLONDIKE EXCITEMENT DRAINED ROSSLAND AND VICINITY OF ITS POPULATION.

WILL RETARD DEVELOPMENT.

W. B. CAMERON SAYS THAT RETURNING ALASKA MINERS REGARD GOLD AS GRAVEL.

MUCH OF IT GOES TO SALOONS.

Story Showing How Little One Man Knows About Another's Success—Trip Out and Return.

W. B. Cameron, associate editor of the Western Field and Stream, of this city, returned last night from an extended trip through the West, in the course of which he visited the Kootenai and the coast cities. In conversation with a reporter for the Globe, Mr. Cameron said:

"The activity on the coast since the tale of Klondike flew round the world is like ozone to the man who has lived with the depression of the past five years, and as his foot touches the pavement of a Sound city, he draws a full breath and gets something of the infection. The grizzled gold seeker of the Sierras brushes elbows with the man from Astoria, or Johnsbury, or Seattle and Victoria streets, and treasure hunters from London and Berlin through the wharves and depot platforms. They come on every boat, they leave on every boat, and still the town is filled. Where will it end? Thousands have gone this year, tens of thousands, probably, will go next. The coming five years is likely to witness the greatest mining excitement in this country since the 'days of '49.'"

"There is much rivalry between Seattle, Victoria, Vancouver and Tacoma for the Yukon business. So far, Seattle seems to have had the best of it, though next spring the Canadian Pacific railway, which will make a strong bid for the large end. They are advertising the fact that no duties are collectable on goods for the Klondike purchased in the Dominion. "I saw plenty of yellow metal from the new land of gold at Seattle, and it seems hardly a doubt that the richness of the country can be much exaggerated. The miners, however, are for the most part very reticent about the amount of mineral they have taken out. One man, who had mined in Arizona, Montana, Colorado and the other gold-producing states, told me that if it were possible for him to secure all the gold on every one of the small creeks which flow into the Klondike, he would not want the United States treasury for it. He says there will be \$25,000,000 taken out of the country in 1898, and fully that amount annually for many years to come. "The miners all wear huge nuggets of gold in their belts, and carry a bag or two of them about in their pockets. It seems hard for them to become accustomed to the use of the ordinary money of commerce again. They distribute nuggets at the hotels, to the waiters, the bartenders and the servants. They appear to regard gold like match gravel. Many of them have been in the country for several years and are out for a holiday. They will return in the spring. Some of them never mined at all, but owned claims in which they have sold interests at figures ranging from \$3,000 to \$20,000. They will tell you that the country has not been prospected by the government, and that nobody has got down to bed rock. On many of the claims they will not look at \$10 dirt (ground which pays only \$10 to the pan), but will cover it up with the gravel that has been worked over. "Perhaps half the gold taken out finds its way into the saloons, and the other half into equally unprofitable resorts. I heard a man at Seattle enquiring of one of the returned miners for a friend who had gone into the Klondike, and he said: 'He asked him how he was getting on. "I don't know," replied the non-committal gold digger. "How about the Kootenai district?" "It is a rich country and will be all right in time," replied the returned miner. "They have some magnificent mining properties there. The celebrated Le Roi lifts about \$15,000 worth of gold ore a day, and pays \$100,000 a month in his share of Le Roi dividends from stock he holds, and there is a boarding house keeper whose receipts reach about a like amount from the same source. There are properties adjoining his mine which are likely to prove quite as valuable. Believers of the Kootenai country try to make people believe that the Le Roi is the only mine in the district, and will show the falsity of such statements. The country is extremely rich in silver, particularly around Slocan lake, Sandon and Nelson. Many of these mines will pay quite as well as the Le Roi or any other gold property. "Has the Klondike excitement affected the Kootenai?" "Yes, it will retard development there, probably, for some time. I knew men in Rossland who owned valuable property in town, with buildings upon it, as well as promising mining claims in the vicinity, who might have done nothing more than hold their interests and in five years become rich, yet in two days after the Yukon craze struck the town they were ready to sacrifice everything they owned for enough money to land them at Dawson with a year's provisions, after all. It seems to me that the spirit of adventure, the old instinct of savagery inherent in us all that animates men at such times as the thirst for gold. "I met the two greatest men in the West, James Hamilton Lewis and Russell, the cowboy artist. Russell's pictures at Great Falls and Butte are alone worth a trip to Montana to look at. "I wish to say a word about the railroads. I went out over the Northern Pacific and returned over the Great Northern. The scenery along both roads is magnificent, on the western slope of the Rockies and through the Cascade in particular. I could dwell upon the wild grandeur of Clark's Fork of the Columbia and the Kootenai river for a column, but it has been done so often. It is a magic land, and every American, and many others, non-Americans, should see it all for themselves. The Spokane Falls and Northern takes one into Rossland and Nelson, and the Great Northern and the Rondo street, which was extinguished without damage.
