County Attorney Anderson reports that Stella gave him two reasons—first, that she was afraid of Stan Donnelly, the attorney for Dougherty, who had subjected her to a searching cross-examination in court; and secondly, that she had been advised by a certain party that the best thing she could do was to leave town.
