

JOHN "HONEY" REPLICANS SING WANAMAKER THE "WE WANT YER" SONG

Anti-Quay Movement in the State Given a Decided Impetus at a Conference of Business and Party Men Opposed to the Senator and His Methods.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 2.—The anti-Quay movement in the Republican party received an impetus here today at a conference, there were present about 400 persons from all sections of the state. The conference was held under the auspices of the business men's league.

The conference was called to order by Elias Deemer, of Williamsport, who stated that the meeting had been called in behalf of the Republicans of the state who desired the removal of a governor who would administer the affairs of the state without the dictation of any one man.

The conference was in session about three hours. Quite a number of speeches were made denunciatory of the United States senators from Philadelphia, particularly censuring the political methods of Senator Quay. The dominant feature of the state legislature also came in for its share of reprobation.

The sentiment of nearly all the speakers was in favor of the nomination of John Wanamaker as the candidate of the Republican party for governor. The names of Congressman Ditzell and C. W. Stone were frequently mentioned and applauded.

After a lengthy discussion a resolution was adopted urging Mr. Wanamaker to accept the nomination of the Republican party for governor. The resolution was adopted by a large majority.

The conference adopted a lengthy platform of principles in the form of an address to the Republican voters of the state. It declares the condition of politics in the state to be disgraceful and that the present administration is brought about by the expenditure of money to corrupt and debauch the voters.

MORALS OF THE MIMIC WORLD. Stage Men and Women, Says Mansfield, No Worse Than Those in Society.

CHICAGO, Feb. 2.—Richard Mansfield gave a talk at the Kent theater, University of Chicago, today, before the graduates and their invited guests. Mr. Mansfield was warmly greeted and frequently applauded for his scholarly and eloquent dissertation.

Afterwards a reception was given him at the residence of Prof. and Mrs. Johnson, where for over an hour he shook hands with the long line of invited guests. All the faculty and their wives were present, together with many of the most prominent people of this city.

Mr. Mansfield severely condemned music halls and cheap theaters, and declared that money spent in them is money which properly belongs to the drama of this country. He deplored the lack of a great American playwright and appealed to the rising generation to devote their minds to the writing of great plays.

The speaker objected to "personal criticism," and referred to the fact that he had once been criticized for breaking in on the conversation of a group of men. He asserted that the stage is no more and is perhaps less immoral than society, and severely scored a prominent Boston dramatic critic for his attack on the morals of the stage.

POLICY OF RULE OR RUIN. CHAIRMAN WALKER, OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE, BLAMED FOR IT.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 2.—The house committee on banking and currency held a turbulent session today over the pending propositions for currency revision.

Early in the meeting, Mr. Johnson (Rep., Ind.) had a heated colloquy with Chairman Walker, in the course of which Mr. Johnson repeatedly charged that the chairman was pursuing a "rule or ruin" policy as to the line of currency action, which the committee should take.

Mr. Walker, in reply, stated that he would regard Mr. Johnson's course as personal if it was persisted in. Later, Mr. Hill (Conn.) moved to take up the measure embodying the president's recommendations as to three specific changes in the banking laws.

BRITISH LION ROARING. PRESS IN A RAGE OVER THE BACK DOWN IN THE FAR EAST

Premier Salisbury Apparently Has Once More Proved His Claim to Be Known as "The Greatest Fink in Europe"—Demand for Equal Rights in China Withdrawn.

LONDON, Feb. 2.—A wave of indignation has swept over the press throughout the country at Lord Salisbury's alleged backdown at Ta Lien Wan. Conservatives no less than Liberals bewail the supposed retreat from an unassailable position, on the ground that Great Britain, supported by the United States, might safely have defended Russia.

It is understood that the government is angry with the Times for revealing this afternoon the fact that the Standard this morning in the course of an editorial expressing its regret, assumes that since there is no official information as to the exact nature of the Standard's version of the situation is correct. It thinks "this will be painfully felt in the course of the pending by-elections and especially as the Standard suggests suspicions of a larger and wider surrender."

The Times announcement caused much surprise and excitement among politicians, and was eagerly discussed at the clubs. The Standard, in its denunciation of the reported backdown of the British government, while the Conservative members of the house of commons were not present, declined to credit the report until it should be officially confirmed, and a prominent Conservative member of the house of commons, an opponent to pay a substantial sum to public charity if the reported backdown should be confirmed.

TROUBLES FOR TIBBLES. LIVELY FIGHT IS ON FOR THE INSPECTOR'S SHOES

Senator Allison, of Iowa, and Gen. Henderson, congressman from that state, are pulling in opposite directions. Mr. Tawney, of Iowa, is a candidate for the position. The Iowa delegation also wants to keep Tibbles in office for the reason that since his appointment he has succeeded in having the headquarters for the district removed from St. Paul to Dubuque. It was stated at the time that the removal was only temporary, but it seems to be a pretty permanent removal. Tibbles is supposed to be a Democrat, but the fact that he is backed by a man like Senator Allison will be a power in his favor.

Representative Tawney is working hard to get this position for John Howard, a river man from Lake City, Wis. Tawney, however, will hardly succeed now, for Senator Nelson will be against him anyway and Mr. Davis will in all probability recommend the re-appointment of John D. Sloane, who has held the office several years. Supervising Inspector General Dumont, it will be remembered, had some trouble with Sloane at the time of the Sea-Wing disaster, and it is not likely that he will appoint him.

RUSSIAN SOLDIERS READY. Sixty Thousand Men Mobilized at Vladivostok Waiting Orders to Take the Field.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 2.—The steamer De Rio Janeiro, which arrived today from Hong Kong and Yokohama, brought the following Oriental advice: The Japanese cabinet which was duly installed on Jan. 12, is composed as follows: Minister president, Marquis Ito; Minister of foreign affairs, Baron Nishi; Minister of the interior, Baron Komuro; Home affairs, Viscount Yoshikawa; Education, Marquis Saionji; War, Viscount Katsuma; Navy, Marquis Saiko; Agriculture and commerce, Baron Ito.

The Japanese starting squadrons consisting of the battleships Yamato, Matsushima, Hashidate, Chinyu, Akitsushima, Nanbu, Suma and Idzumi, had been ordered to leave Yokosuka for Chinese waters on Jan. 20, shortly before the outbreak of hostilities. The Toka reports state that there are some 60,000 troops in Vladivostok ready to take the field at a moment's notice.

Mr. Sands, secretary of the United States legation at Seoul, was assaulted by a gang of five or six Japanese coolies on the street in Seoul, today, while walking alone. No reason is known for the assault, and the matter is being investigated by the local authorities.

Twenty-one people were killed and thirteen injured at Nigati prefecture owing to the collapse of houses on account of the heavy downfall of snow. On Dec. 24 a steamer, the merchant steamer, Nara, was on a hidden rock off the Peuscar group. She sank immediately, and of eighty people on board, all Japanese, only seven were saved.
