GARRINGTON IS TO HANG.

His Execution Will Be the Second Ever Held in South Dakota. Special to the St. Paul Globe. SIOUX FALLS, S. D., Feb. 9.—The trial of James A. Garrington for the murder of Roy Erickson, which occurred on the night of Dec. 7 last year, was brought to a close this afternoon. The trial has been in progress for the past week and has attracted intense interest among the people of the city and in those sections of the state with which the prisoner will suffer was a particularly brutal one, the victim being cut and gashed almost beyond recognition. The jury came back for instructions twice before reaching a verdict. At 5:45 p. m. they returned and announced that they found the guilty quality of murder, and fixed the penalty at death by hanging. While the result was being announced the old man sat with the same calmness which he has shown during the whole trial, and seemed the least interested one in the court room. The attorney for the defense immediately asked for a stay of sentence, which was granted and the execution will not be passed till 9 o'clock Monday next. The convicted prisoner is an inoffensive looking old man, but has a record of having killed five men. Kipp to be removed and appointed. The defendant did not succeed in getting a new trial it will be the second legal hanging which has ever taken place at Sioux Falls.

LEE SAYS MR. KIPP IS OUT.

Names Avers for Insurance Commissioner—Fight Not Yet Ended. Special to the St. Paul Globe. PIERRE, S. D., Feb. 9.—The fight between Gov. Lee and Insurance Commissioner Kipp culminated today in the governor issuing an order declaring Kipp to be removed and appointing Thomas H. Avers, his private secretary, to the place. The governor charges, cause in that Commissioner Kipp, through his ex-employee, McLaughlin, had been fraudulently collecting fees for examination of insurance companies. A demand has been made on Commissioner McLaughlin, who is in charge of the office, and he has refused to vacate. Notice of the removal has been served on the different state officers interested. Commissioner Kipp will reach here in the morning and will call on Gov. Lee. Avers will hold personal possession of the office. The whole matter will now go to the courts for settlement.

SCOURGE IN NORTH DAKOTA.

Diphtheria and Scarlet Fever Among the Russians. BISMARCK, N. D., Feb. 9.—There is an epidemic of scarlet fever and diphtheria all through the western part of the state, which is believed to have originated among the Russian hundreds of whom have died in Logan, McIntosh and La Moure counties from both scarlet fever and diphtheria. The latter disease is particularly fatal among the Russians. It is known among them as "diphtheria" and the patient, frequently after only a few hours' illness, chokes, the heart fails and the face becomes cyanotic. The disease is so infectious that it has been carried to the appearance of diphtheria among the Russian children and death has been caused. A physician could reach the sick one.

PAPER MILLS RESIGNED.

OSHKOSH, Wis., Feb. 9.—The sale of the Howard paper mill at Neenah, back to its original owner, C. W. Howard, is completed. A member of the Oshkosh board of directors purchased the mill in 1892 for \$100,000, and the syndicate has not something like \$25,000 in trying to operate the plant, and that Mr. Howard purchased it for about \$25,000. It is further stated that Mr. Howard will convert it into a sulphate plant.
