GRANDMA KEEPS MAMIE

JUDGE KELLY DECIDES THE M'LELLAN HABEAS CORPUS

The Mother Allowed to Visit Her Child Whenever She Desires, Nor Can the Little One Be Taken Out of the State Without the Court's Permission.

Judge Kelly rendered his decision yesterday in the matter of the habeas corpus proceedings instituted by Mrs. Bertha McLellan to compel her husband's mother, Mrs. Elizabeth McLellan, to surrender the possession of Mamie McLellan, the petitioner's four-year-old daughter.

Judge Kelly awards the custody of the child to the grandmother, Mrs. Elizabeth McLellan.

After reciting the facts as shown by the testimony submitted on the hearing Tuesday afternoon, Judge Kelly says: "While this case is not without practical difficulty, the court, looking as far as human frailty will permit him to look into the future, has determined that it is a matter of the present at least, the child will be returned to the custody of her grandmother. But this order will be upon the express condition that the relator may visit the child whenever she desires and the child will not be removed even temporarily from the state of Minnesota, except upon application to and permission granted by this court."

Therefore, the court ordered that the writ be vacated and the respondent discharged, without prejudice to a renewal of this application, but the court is to be notified if the relator or the respondent is in violation of the conditions of the order. The court also ordered that the parties changed so that the interests of the child demand further action of the court.

SUPREME COURT DECISIONS.
