STOCK PRICES ADVANCED EARLY

ON BUYING FROM LONDON

Little Budge, Followed by a Steady

Decline That Was Arrested Only

By Trifling Rallies—Net Losses

of From One to Two Points All

Through the General List.

NEW YORK, March 11.—There was a brief

trading this morning, prices having been

advanced on the London exchange above

the New York party to last night. The advance

did not reach the London level, so that there

was considerable arbitrage buying for Lon-

don account. There were some buying orders

usually employed by Washington opera-

tors. This buying soon came to an end and

the market fell to the level of the London

market, which was held by the day's net de-

cline. The strength displayed by American se-

curities was not sufficient to counteract the

weight of the London market, which was in

strong contrast to the weakness of Spanish

government bonds, which are poorly sup-

ported in London and Paris. The only

rational explanation that seems available for

this movement is that London felt that there
