SPAIN'S ERROR IN POLICY

CHAUNCEY DEPEW PAYS HIS RESPECTS TO THE DON'S

Blind Devotion to the Idea of Lord North, Which Lost America to England, Has Cost Spain Her Rich Possessions in the New World—Address Before the Sons of the American Revolution.

NEW YORK, March 19.—This is the anniversary of the downfall of Lord North's ministry, and tonight, marking the occasion, the Empire State Society of the Sons of the American Revolution sat at their annual banquet in this city.

The most notable feature of the occasion was the address of the president of the society, Chauncey M. Depew, who took occasion to make reference to Spain and her methods of colonial government.

Mr. Depew then addressed the members of the society, and in his address he alluded to the Spanish policy of the past, and the methods of the American Revolution.

Spain's Error. One power alone in Europe sympathized with the people of the Spanish empire in their attack upon the rights of the American people.

That power was Spain. She had at that time the most magnificent colonial empire; she possessed nearly one-half, and the most productive half, of the continent of North America.
