INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., June 1.—The Saints narrowly escaped a shut-out today. Geier, who was given first on balls, was responsible for this leading home from third on Glasscock's single to center in the closing inning. Two were out and Glenavlin, who had also hit safely, tried to reach third, but was thrown out there, and Geier had hardly crossed the rubber.

Howley pitched a brilliant game and held the "Suggers" down to four lone singles. He was given perfect support by his team mates.

Phyle was a pudding for the Champions, who hit him hard throughout the game. Only one error was made behind him, but this cost the first run, Hogriever scoring on C. Calvin's wild throw and Hoffmeister's tag fly, after reaching first on a single and second on a sacrifice. A base on balls, a sacrifice and a double and single gave two in the sixth. A brace of triples and four singles registered down to four lone singles.
