

THE DEHORNING OF CATTLE. ADVANTAGES FROM A HUMANE POINT OF VIEW. The Results Justify the Practice—Useless Appendage Which Can Be Painlessly Removed—Calfhood Is the Period for the Accomplishment of the Work—Suggestions by Prof. Lawson.

Humanity and the welfare of the animal are the two great factors in the humane treatment of the animal. It is a humane act to remove the horns of a cow at an early age, and it is a humane act to do so in a painless manner.

It is claimed by some experts that the dehorning of bulls and heifer calves systematically and scientifically pursued will result, after a few years, if they are mated with one another, in the production of a natural hornless breed. This is a very desirable result, and it is one which should be aimed at.

Prof. H. H. Lawson, of the New Hampshire agricultural experiment station, has issued a bulleting treating of the practice of dehorning in its various phases. This is what he says, in part: The horns of cattle consist of two parts, of different origin, the outer horny shell is a growth derived from the epidermis of the forehead.

When properly applied it destroys the matrix of the horn, and the underlying peristome, from which the horny pith grows. The horn is cut away as thoroughly as possible, so that the pith does not remain in contact with the parts to be treated.
