Yesterday in the house of representatives, when the adjournment hour came, Gen. Joe Wheeler, the gallant old ex-Confederate cavalry leader and now one of Shafter's ablest associate commanders at Santiago, received the enthusiastic cheers of all his former colleagues in the house without distinction of party.
