

GOV. CLOUGH FINALLY ACTS

WIRES THE PRESIDENT ON BEHALF MINNESOTA SOLDIERS

As They Were the First Under the Call, He Tells the President That It Seems Minnesota Has Been Neglected—The Fifteenth Will Go to Jacksonville Eventually—Adj. Gen. Corbin Writes.

The failure of the war department to detail for active duty either of the two Minnesota regiments now at Camp Thomas has been the source of no little dissatisfaction, both among the troops themselves and the patriotic citizens of the state who were anxious that Minnesota be represented in the campaign in Cuba.

Although first to respond to the call to arms, the state has been accorded little recognition by the war department, and this fact has occasioned great dissatisfaction, for the reason that the Twelfth and Fourteenth regiments are admitted among the best drilled and equipped volunteer regiments now in the service, and from the first there was every reason to believe that they would be detailed for active duty early in the campaign.

The governor, brought to the attention of the war department, was dissatisfied with the letter, worded in no uncertain terms, by Col. Joseph Bobleter, of the Twelfth regiment, commanding in chief, and the policy of the war department, and led the governor to direct a long telegram to President McKinley yesterday on the subject. The governor's message is as follows:

President William McKinley, Washington, D. C.—Under the first call for troops Minnesota was the first to respond to the call to mobilize her troops and get them all out of the state. The Twelfth and Fourteenth regiments were the first to be called, and none in the United States, according to all reports, and at the same time they are still in camp. It seems to me that Minnesota has been sadly neglected. So many other regiments inferior to mine have been detailed, drill and general fitness for field work, have been given preference and sent to the front. Our officers and soldiers, and also the entire people of our state feel that we are not receiving fair treatment.

It is not possible to get at least one of our regiments now at Chickamauga into active service?—D. C. Clough, Governor.

Gov. Clough's action in communicating with the president direct was only taken after repeated requests made of the Washington officials to look into the matter had been passed up.

Col. Bobleter's letter, which was received by the governor a few days ago, said the officers and men were chafing under the daily routine of camp life, when regiments on all sides of the campaign, and they, as one of the national guard regiments, had been left in camp for several months without any prospect of rendering their country the service for which they were called out. The regiments which had gone to Cuba in many instances greatly inferior to either of the two Minnesota regiments, and there was no little disappointment and dissatisfaction in evidence among the men.

The colonel wrote, also, that the men would not have a word to say if it were not for the fact of the record which Minnesota made in getting her troops ready under the first call. Being the first to respond to the call, it was only fair that they should be given some part in the campaign.

Gov. Clough wired the colonel yesterday that he had communicated with the president direct and would advise him as soon as anything developed on the premises. A reply was not received yesterday.

Discussing the prospects for an early departure of the Fifteenth regiment, now in camp at Camp Ramsey, the governor said that he received a telegram from H. C. Corbin, adjutant general of the United States, about a week ago, stating that the Fifteenth would be ordered to Jacksonville just as soon as the sanitary conditions at that place were sufficiently improved to make their station at that point a safe one. The governor said nothing had been heard since that time, but, incidentally, mentioned that Gen. Lucius F. Hubbard had written him within the last week from Jacksonville, saying that there was no fever there, and the place was never in a more healthy condition.

The governor is inclined to foster a belief that the war department would not assign the regiments still remaining in the state raised under the second call until some definite action has been taken to the outcome of the peace negotiations now in progress.

ARE FIGHTING THE FEVER

SANITARY WORK BEING DONE AT CAMP RAMSEY

Hoped That the Start Typhoid Gained Has Been Successfully Headed Off—Fever Sick Calls Yesterday—Than on Previous Days—Minnesota Red Cross Society Offers to Care for Forty Sick Soldiers.

There is a practical understanding among the physicians who have diagnosed the sick cases at Camp Ramsey and the Twin City hospitals that there are some cases of typhoid fever among the men of the Fifteenth. Rigid Military Censorship Observed in Spain's Capital. LONDON, Aug. 10.—A Madrid dispatch to the Times says: "The most rigid military censorship is exercised today. The newspapers are not allowed to refer to the plot against Senor Sagasta's life nor to the appearance of revolutionary bands in the Castilian province. Concerning the plot, it is said the conspirators have drawn lots to decide which they shall carry out in its purpose, and that the task has fallen upon an American named Disball, who has suffered imprisonment in the fortress of Montjuich for his participation in one of the Barcelona anarchist outrages, and whose sentence was recently commuted by the supreme court to expulsion from Castellan. The band consists of twenty men. According to some accounts they are Republicans and others say they are Carlists. Their first plan was to attack a custom post and capture all the arms. Next they cut all the telegraph and telephone wires."

Alleged Orders for an Uprising of Don Carlos's Followers. BRUSSELS, Aug. 10.—An exceedingly doubtful story is published by the Soire, of this city, in a dispatch from Barcelona, which says that at a recent meeting of the Carlist leaders it was decided to immediately take action, and that orders were issued for the Carlists to assemble. It is further said to be reported that Don Carlos personally enters Spain on Monday or Tuesday next, and that in the meanwhile 180,000 rifles and quantities of ammunition have reached the Carlists.

BEST OF A BAD BARGAIN. Governor General Machias Admits Spanish Troops Are Retreating. MADRID, Aug. 10.—An official dispatch received from San Juan, Porto Rico, says: "American forces returning from Guayama attacked the heights of Guayama. A force under Maj. Hayes kept up continuous fire for several hours, and we sustained the attack, the enemy's fire being ultimately silenced. We suffered no loss. The enemy's loss is not known. The village of Guayama had been attacked by a superior force and had to be abandoned. Our troops are retreating. —Macias."

GOLD IN THE PHILIPPINES. An Investigation of Mineral Deposits There to Be Made. WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—Members of the geologic survey are of the opinion that the Philippines may be rich in gold and ore deposits, and say it is known gold is to be found there. The intention to make an investigation of the mineral deposits of the island and Dr. Baker, of the geologic survey, will shortly proceed to Manila. He will take with him a party of geologists and stay in the Philippines.

AMERICAN ENTERPRISE. One Hundred Miles of Military Telegraph in Porto Rico. WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—Gen. Greely is advised that 100 miles of military telegraph are now in operation in Porto Rico, connecting the points occupied by the United States troops with the cable station at Ponce.

SPAIN NEEDS CURRENCY. Queen Regent Signs Decree Providing for Increased Note Issues. MADRID, Aug. 10.—The queen regent has signed a decree arranging for the payment of the external debt and authorizing the conversion of the debt and providing for an increase in the note issue of the Bank of Spain.

War Revenue Ruling. WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—Information having reached the internal revenue bureau that certain express companies were shipping packages of cigars, the commissioner has made a ruling. The ruling heretofore made that "each bundle of newspapers having a different destination should have a different bill of lading and be stamped" is modified in view of the opinions of senators and members of congress that was not the intention of the law. Therefore, when the tax of one cent is paid on the general bundle, each package in the general bundle, the commissioner holds, which is taken therefrom and delivered at intermediate points, does not require a separate receipt or stamp.
