

CREDITORS HAVE HOPES

EXPECT TODD'S BANK TO PAY A BIG DIVIDEND Committee Reports That the Insolvent Banker Is Showing a Disposition to Tell the Truth About His Business Affairs, and That Something May Be Saved From the Wreck—News of the Northwest.

ST. PAUL, Minn., Aug. 31.—The creditors' committee appointed to interview J. R. Clements, Banker Todd's partner, returned from La Crosse and reported that Clements at first denied everything, but finally confessed that he had drawn about \$2,000 out of the bank yearly for six or seven years, and that when he and Todd dissolved partnership he (Clements) had drawn out one-third of \$35,000. All this amount, with interest, Clements says he is willing and even anxious to return to the creditors. Clements stated that when the bank was organized Mrs. Green had put in about \$11,000. Todd a like amount, while Clements put up Minneapolis property worth about \$9,000, as his share. He still has the property and is astonished that the money is not regarded as his. Clements says he wants a man to investigate, and if it appears that the money turned over to him was not his, he will at once turn over about \$40,000.

The creditors' committee has prepared the following report: Mr. Todd is now manifesting a desire to give the creditors a complete statement of the affairs of his bank and of the disposition of the moneys placed therein. His estimate of the liabilities is that they are about \$60,000. Further investigation may vary this amount. He claims Mr. Clements, of La Crosse, has from \$35,000 to \$40,000 of the moneys and maybe more. He claims also some loss in interest and expense account.

Messrs. Gray, Thompson, Grattan and others waited on Mr. Clements at La Crosse yesterday. He admits that he received moneys at the hands of Mr. Todd particularly only to this extent: viz., about \$14,000 as his share of earnings; \$11,555 as his share of capital, and \$800 for his good will in the business at the time he claims to have withdrawn therefrom. He assured the committee that he would restore these several amounts with interest, if upon investigation it is shown that he was not entitled to the same.

Mr. Todd has transferred to T. J. Melchen, in trust for the creditors, the bank and residence property; also the stock in Preston. He estimates the value of this property at \$10,000.

So far your committee has been unable to discover other property than as stated, but they will continue their efforts to ascertain and secure for the creditors all the property possible to reach to satisfy claims.
