ST. CLOUD, Sept. 2.—(Special.)—A meeting was held tonight by the stockholders of the Mutual Building Association to discuss an alleged shortage discovered in the accounts of J. J. Troutman, the secretary of the corporation. Nearly one hundred shareholders were present and much indignation was expressed at the report showing an actual shortage of \$33,336, of which Troutman, it is charged, personally appropriated \$13,000. The balance, it is alleged, was misapplied to maturing shares.

Articles of Incorporation.

Articles of Incorporation of Minneapolis and Champlin Suburban Railway Company. KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that the undersigned persons, for the purpose of associating themselves together and forming a corporation, under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Minnesota, and more especially the provisions of Chapter 34 of the General Statutes of said State, and acts amendatory thereof, have adopted and filed with the clerk of said State of Minnesota the following Articles of Incorporation as follows:

ARTICLE ONE. The name of this corporation shall be "Minneapolis and Champlin Suburban Railway Company," and the general nature of its business shall be to construct, equip, maintain, operate and own a railway, with one or more tracks or lines of road, with all necessary bridges, structures, right of ways, lands and appurtenances necessary for the purpose of operating and maintaining a village of Champlin, in said State of Minnesota, as well as to build, own, maintain and operate one or more lines of railway in such manner as the Board of Directors may prescribe, consistent with the articles and the laws of the State of Minnesota.

ARTICLE TWO. This corporation shall commence on the eighth day of September, A. D. 1898, and shall continue for the term of ninety-nine (99) years.

ARTICLE THREE. The amount of the capital stock of the corporation shall be one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, to be paid in full from time to time, and in such manner as the Board of Directors may prescribe, consistent with the articles and the laws of the State of Minnesota.

ARTICLE FOUR. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which said corporation shall at any time be subject is one hundred and thirty thousand dollars (\$130,000.00).

ARTICLE FIVE. The names and places of residence of persons forming said corporation are as follows, to-wit: Emory W. Hill, Apollonia, Wisconsin; Clifford D. Staples, Saint Paul, Minnesota; Henry Woodbury, Saint Paul, Minnesota; Collinwood Evans, Minneapolis, Minnesota; Henry Woodbury, Saint Paul, Minnesota; Clifford D. Staples, Saint Paul, Minnesota; Henry Woodbury, Saint Paul, Minnesota; Anthony Chryst, Grant, Washington Co., Minnesota.

ARTICLE SIX. The government of this corporation and the management of its affairs shall be vested in a board of directors, who shall be elected for the term of one year, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. Vacancies ad interim shall be filled by the remaining members of such board. The names of the first Board of Directors are: Emory W. Hill, President; Clifford D. Staples, Vice President; Henry Woodbury, Secretary; Anthony Chryst, Treasurer; Collinwood Evans, Auditor.

ARTICLE SEVEN. The executive officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. The Board of Directors shall make all regulations and by-laws which shall be consistent with the articles and the laws of the State of Minnesota.

ARTICLE EIGHT. The number of shares of the capital stock of the corporation is fifteen hundred (1,500), and the value of each share is one hundred dollars (\$100.00). In testimony whereof, the undersigned have hereunto set their hands and seals this 27th day of August, A. D. 1898.
