GOODBAR IS ON TRIAL

WORK OF SECURING A JURY BEGUN IN THE LYLE MURDER CASE

WITNESS STONE WANTED

The Defendant, According to His Attorney's Statement, Depends Upon the Absent Man to Save His Neck From the Noose—Objection to the Jury Overruled by the Court—News of Minneapolis.

MINNEAPOLIS, Oct. 11.—The trial of John Goodbar in the shooting of William Lyle on Washington avenue last August was taken up before Judge Harrison this morning.

A. H. Hall, one of Goodbar's attorneys, moved for a continuance, presenting in support thereof an affidavit of J. Frank Wheaton relative to the absence of the witness Stone. The affidavit stated that Stone had not yet been reached, but would be secured if time was given and would testify to certain facts which constitute the essence of the defense. The story was in substance as follows:

Stone and Lyle were standing in front of Hamilton's saloon on Washington avenue south on the evening of August 11 when Goodbar came along and with a smile asked the two to take drinks and then passed on into the saloon without waiting for an acceptance. Goodbar was scarcely inside of the door before Lyle pulled a revolver from his pocket and after a slight examination passed on into the saloon. Goodbar a moment later had opened his gun upon Goodbar, who the latter pulled his gun and shot Lyle through the abdomen. Shortly before the two had been together in a gambling place and had been involved in a quarrel in which Lyle had struck Goodbar with his fist.

The court denied the motion. Mr. Hall then stated that he desired to have a chance to the jury, and that he had once offered as his grounds those offered in the Nelson case last fall. Judge Harrison this afternoon found the challenge not true, and the case went on with irregularity. The work of selecting a jury was begun.

The defense late yesterday received word that Stone, the missing witness, would return and testify if his expenses were paid.

ORMOND'S DEATH MURDER.

Police Satisfied That He Came to His Death by Fool-Play.

MINNEAPOLIS, Oct. 11.—The police have reached the conclusion that Dr. W. M. Ormond, the wealthy Rochester farmer, has been murdered. They believe he was made away with because he had a large sum of money. The police are now devoting all their energies to working out this theory, and in the last twenty-four hours they have made considerable progress in this time. His mysterious disappearance on Sept. 22.

Today the detectives were able to trace the doctor to this city and to a yard on the corner of Washington and Third. This is a positive gain, as heretofore they were only able to trace him as far as a Minneapolis-bound interurban car at Midway.

Mr. Ormond came up from Rochester today to see the body found near Edina Mills Saturday. It had been buried, but from a description of the bones, which had been buried, Mr. Ormond was inclined to think that the remains might be those of his wife. The grave will be opened tomorrow to establish the identity.

JAMESON ON THE STAND.

Evidence of the Plaintiff Offered in the Action Against Lloyd.

MINNEAPOLIS, Oct. 11.—In the slander suit against Alderman Lloyd today, William Jameson, the plaintiff, was on the stand and under a severe cross examination. Edward M. Gibson, the defendant, was also on the stand, and the defense on cross examination trying to show that certain portions of the evidence relative to the support of the witness related purely to business and not to the fact that certain portions of the evidence were given to the support of the witness against his parents.
