BURGLARS ARE BUSY

BAND OF CRACKSMEN MAKING ITS HEADQUARTERS AT MINNEAPOLIS

OFFER TO RETURN THE BONDS

The Thieves Who Robbed the Safe of the Hardwood Manufacturing Company Discover That the Heavily Insured Securities Are of No Value to Them—Want a Reward for Their Restoration.

MINNEAPOLIS—The gang of safe breakers, which operated in South Minneapolis several weeks ago is again becoming exasperatingly industrious. They are now working in the milling district, where there is no police protection. However, their efforts have been unsuccessful so far, and they have secured nothing of any great value. Their method is to use a sledge hammer on the combination of a safe and when the doors are open to loot the stronghold at their leisure.

The offices of the Armour Packing company, 413 Second street south, and of the National Milling company, 529 First street south, were visited in this manner. No money or valuables were secured. It is believed to be the same gang who entered the office of the Hardwood Manufacturing company several nights ago.

The police are rounding up every suspicious character in the city in the effort to locate the gang. Since the robbery of the safe of the Hardwood Manufacturing company the thieves have learned that the \$6,000 in registered government bonds taken care of no value to any one but the real owner.

The securities belonged to the niece of George C. Christian, president of the company. It was ascertained yesterday that the stolen documents would be returned provided a reward was advertised in the papers. This was done and \$25 was paid on the combination. A second letter followed two days ago to the effect that the reward was not sufficiently large and he was directed to increase the amount, as the bonds were of considerable value to him.

DULUTH, Minn., Oct. 15.—Work has been commenced on the cut-off of the Eastern Minnesota railroad which will shorten the distance between Duluth and Minneapolis over thirty miles.

The feature of the meeting, it is said, is the fact that representatives of roads west of Chicago are present at the meeting, though their business is outside of the territory of the Central Traffic Association. It is said that the possibility of the newly formed steel trust trying to break up the association is a practical matter. Its own rates will cause the association to strain every nerve to strengthen it. Cheaper freights will also be an additional weapon in the hands of the trust.
