"Unmanly and Cowardly!"

It has always been a recognized privilege of citizens in this country, when they believed they had just cause for complaint against public officials, to formulate, in some manner, their complaint, and, where the source of the grievance involved a body or system comprising a number of officials, to refer thereto in a general way, relying upon possible investigation for sifting the innocent from the guilty.

There have been cases, for instance, where suspicions of corruption existed against a city board of aldermen; but it has usually happened that the man who realized his individual freedom from guilt has not felt called upon to defend his own innocence, or, if he was chairman of the board, to indignantly stigmatize the action of the complainants against the body in general as "unmanly and cowardly."

But Judge Ira B. Mills, chairman of the Minnesota railroad and warehouse commission, thus characterizes the farmers of the state who, in a perfectly legitimate and proper manner, assembled together individually and by representation, and formulated a general complaint against the system of grading and docking wheat. The grain inspectors are state officials co-operating under the prevailing system. It is believed by the complainants that the willful practices of these officials have resulted in robbing the grain producers of Minnesota of hundreds of thousands of dollars; that the law is being evaded, and that the result is primarily, in the special interests of the elevator and milling potentates of Minneapolis and elsewhere, with the secondary object of retaining the officials in their lucrative offices, which result can be the more positively assured through the continued domination of the Republican party in the state.

According to the views of Judge Mills it is "unmanly and cowardly" to complain against abuses of the law, which have become notorious, but would it not be more unmanly and more cowardly, not only to submit to the abuses and outrages, but to the insolence of the head of the board as well?
