DAMAGE TO THE EXTENT OF \$10,000 DONE BY FIRE AT MINNEAPOLIS.

TURNED FOR THE THIRD TIME

Co-operative Barrel Company Unfortunate in the Matter of Coal-Magistrations—The Loss Half Covered by Insurance on Stock and Building—Fireman Seriously Hurt—The News of Minneapolis.

MINNEAPOLIS, Nov. 3.—The plant of the Hennepin County Co-operative barrel company, fourteen avenue south and Fifth street, was razed to the ground this morning by a fierce fire. While the large force of employees were at work a burst of flames came from the dry kiln, and the next moment the entire structure was in flames. The building was burned to the ground, and the large stock was completely destroyed, entailing a loss of \$10,000.

AWFUL ABUSES ARE EXPOSED. War Inquiry Board Gets Evidence of Incompetency in Management of Government Hospitals for Invalidated Troops—Sink Holes and Contaminated Water Supply but Incidents of Conditions.
