It was in the summer of 1865 that the name Meadow Lake was formally given to the town, previously called Excelsior and Summit City.

With the close of the fall of 1865 the new city contained about 150 houses completed and a number of others in course of construction.

Henry Hartly, an Englishman, who visited the vicinity in June, 1863, in search of game and chanced to discover fragments of gold.

For years the solitary inhabitant of Meadow Lake was Hartly, the Englishman who had mainly responsibility for the existence of the town.

Sheriff Wagner Goes Through With the 2,000 to Spare That He Had Two Years Ago—Miesen by Unofficial Returns Seems to Have Been Beaten by Arosin—Figures on the Entire Ticket.

Sheriff Wagner and Judge Dunn were the only Democratic candidates elected on the county ticket. Anton Miesen, the Democratic candidate for county treasurer on the face of the returns, has been defeated by Fire Commissioner Arosin, by 177 votes. There is some talk of a recount in order to

make sure that Miesen was not counted out after the polls closed. Bigelow defeated Oppenheim. The other candidates on the Democratic county ticket were defeated by larger pluralities.

Wagner won easily from the Irish-Chapel syndicate, and had 1,900 more votes than the once deputy sheriff. Below are given the unofficial returns. The county auditor will commence the official canvass of the votes to-day:
