COMPTROLLER McCARDY SUBMITS HIS BUDGET FOR THE COMING YEAR OFFERS SOME SUGGESTIONS

Money Needed for New School Buildings, and Improvements on Many of the Bridges—No Provision for an Increase in Cost of Lighting the City—Suggests the Abolition of an Office.

Comptroller McCurdy presented to the conference committee yesterday afternoon the tax estimate for 1899. The estimated expenses, as figured out by the comptroller, are \$1,674,130, but, as \$260,000 of this sum will be estimated, to be received from miscellaneous sources, such as liquor and other licenses, the total amount necessary to be raised by taxation is \$1,414,130.

Comptroller McCurdy presented to the conference committee yesterday afternoon the tax estimate for 1899. The estimated expenses, as figured out by the comptroller, are \$1,674,130, but, as \$260,000 of this sum will be estimated, to be received from miscellaneous sources, such as liquor and other licenses, the total amount necessary to be raised by taxation is \$1,414,130.

HIS SUGGESTIONS. There has been since Jan. 1, 1892, \$2,190,417 of interest-bearing debt paid off, all for permanent improvements made from the year 1873 to the year 1892. It is unfair to the present tax paying community to require it to pay for certain permanent improvements which are now necessary. It will require at least \$100,000 for the erecting of new school buildings and permanently repairing many of the present school buildings.
