After a Year's Legal Separation Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Gisch Remarry. After eighteen years of married life together and one year of separation by a decree of divorce, Joseph Gisch and Josephine Gisch were united in marriage for the second time yesterday by Court Commissioner Gallick. With tears streaming down the faces of both they told the story of their estrangement and how they had become reconciled through the mediation of their 17-year-old son. The Gischs for years had resided on a forty-acre farm out in Mounds View township and raised a family of four children, the oldest of whom, Joseph Jr., is now 11. Some time ago there came a cloud over their domestic felicity, which resulted in a decree of divorce being granted to Mrs. Gisch, last fall, on the grounds of cruel and inhuman treatment.

After the divorce Gisch went ninety miles up into the country to work and Mrs. Gisch went to live on the farm with her children. She was contented for a time, but the absence of the husband and father threw a cloud over the household and grieved Mrs. Gisch found that she had no happiness in life. When Joseph Jr., who had been endeavoring manfully to aid his mother in her struggle to run the farm, perceived that something must be done. ## ALL SAY A DEMOCRAT

SHOULD BE SELECTED BY THE UNION FORCES IN THE LEGISLATURE

FOR A COMPLIMENTARY VOTE

The Sentiment Is That in Taking This Stand They Are Not Asking Anything More Than What the Allied Forces Should Be Willing to Grant—What Local Members of the Party Have to Say.

The position taken by The Globe in an editorial in its issue of last Thursday, when it also printed an interview with Hon. T. D. O'Brien on the same line, that the members of the coming legislature who are opposed to the election of a Republican senator from this state, should unite in giving their votes to some Democrat, finds indorsement in every party while there is no possible chance for any other Republican being elected to the United States senate this year, and, as little doubt that Senator Davis will be that man, at the same time it is felt there is something more than an empty honor in being selected as the nominee for such position, and at this particular time the sentiment is general and unanimous among Democrats that such honor should be conferred upon that branch of the union forces. The question of a choice for the honor is for the members of the legislature to determine. Nobody wants to state a man. But all want a Democrat, as can be seen by the following interviews:

**Aid. E. L. Murphy—**  
"I agree with the idea expressed by Mr. O'Brien in his interview. It seems to me that the Democrats cannot be accused of anything more than their share of recognition. In fact, I think they have been willing to give the other wings of the union forces even more than what might be expected in proportionate share of the places, if they had so desired. So that in this case it seems to me to be a reasonable thing to do. I am in favor of the election of the members elected in opposition to the Republicans should be a Democrat."

**R. W. Bell—**  
"There is no question about the matter, but what the honor should be given to a Democrat. There are some Democrats anyway who have been elected to the legislature than those of any other of the union forces, and that alone is sufficient ground in my opinion for reasonably asking such recognition."

**Pierce Butler—**  
"I am in favor of the Democrats in the legislature voting as a unit for a Democrat for the senate. It is true that there is not apparently any prospect of electing a Democrat, but, regardless of that fact, I think that the party should stand together, and if there is any chance of electing a Democrat by a vote of this kind, even though it be purely complimentary, the compliment should be paid to the men who have borne the burden of the issue. The Democracy is known to us all. There are many men who would answer to these requirements whom it would not be out of place for the Democrats in the legislature to compliment. Philip B. Winston, of Minneapolis, is one of these, and I would not be displeased to see him made the choice of the Democrats. It is in accord with the policy of territorial expansion which has been adopted by the present federal administration, and it is therefore some questions of deep import involved in the vote which shall be cast for senator by the Democrats of Minnesota, as well as the issue of political expediency which should prompt Democrats to vote for men of their own political faith."

**B. J. Moser, Stillwater—**  
"I think that the Democratic members of the legislature should vote as a unit for a Democrat for the United States senator. It does not make any difference in theory whether he is to get 10 votes or 110. The party should stand together, and if there is any chance of electing a Democrat, the party should be willing to stand by nominees who represent its principles."

**P. P. Swenson, Minneapolis—**  
"I think that by all means the Democrats should vote for a Democrat for a senator. Any good Democrat will suit me."

**Clarence E. Robb—**  
"The senatorial election is or should be an important consideration with the Democratic party, and it is in accord with a Democratic organization, we must have some basis for it, and if we have any basis for it, we must stick to it. The Democrats are in a position to elect a Democrat, but if Mr. O'Brien does not desire the nomination, which is, of course, at this time purely complimentary, P. B. Winston, or any other good Democrat, to be elected, but let the nominee be a Democrat."

**James H. Bell—**  
"I am distinctly in favor of the Democrats uniting and voting solidly for a Democrat for the senate. It is an empty honor, perhaps, but if there were no other arguments to be urged in favor of it than the one of political expediency, it seems to me that the duty of the Democracy is to itself and its principles to do so."

**Hampden Barton—**  
"In my judgment the Democrats of the state, the rank and file, I mean, demand that their representatives in the state legislature shall vote for a Democrat for the senate. It will be a compliment to the party, and if they are swayed from that purpose by any consideration of sentiment or courtesy to an individual, it is essential to the perpetuity of the party. It is an honor that it should stand for Democracy openly, honestly, earnestly and continuously."

**James A. Meade—**  
"If the reform forces in the legislature agree on a nominee, I would be in favor of abiding by the judgment of the majority, be their choice who he might, only providing, of course, that he be identified with the cause which the union forces represent in this state. The Republicans stand as one party, and the opposition should be no less coherent."

**George C. Lambert—**  
"I think if a complimentary vote is given any one by the fusion forces for United States senator, it should be a Democrat by all means. It is no more than just, as the Democrats are in the majority, and the fusionists have been recognized quite liberally already."

**J. E. Michael—**  
"My opinion is that the vote of the union forces should be cast for a Democrat, but I care not who he is so long as he is some good, representative man of the party.
