CONTRIVERSY BETWEEN THE N. P. AND O. R. & N. IN SIGHT OF SETTLEMENT.

TO COME EARLY NEXT MONTH. President Mellen Replies to the Attack Written by Thomas F. Woodcock of New York, to a London Paper About the Dispute Over the Clearwater River Territory—What Contracts Specify.

The controversy between the Northern Pacific and the Oregon Railway and Navigation company respecting the right of the former to build new lines in the Clearwater river territory is likely to be amicably settled early next month.

President Mellen said he did not wish to contradict all that Mr. Woodcock had written, as it would take too much time, as his statements were very true.

"The facts," said President Mellen, "are that there are contracts which have been in existence since 1880, signed by the presidents of the Oregon Railway and Navigation and the Northern Pacific Railway companies, and ratified by the boards of directors of each company.
