NEW YORK, Dec. 27.—Joe Gans, of Baltimore, outpointed Jack Daily, of Wilmington, Del., in a twenty-five-round bout, at 129 pounds, before the Lenox Athletic club tonight, and the referee decided in favor of the Baltimorean.

The referee's decision did not suit many of those who witnessed the contest, but the conservative judges agreed that the colored boy was entitled to the decision.

Gans was a top-heavy favorite in the betting, but Daily's showing was a big surprise to many who had thought that the colored boy would have an easy mark.

In a preliminary bout Jim Ganey, colored, of Baltimore, defeated Dan Sullivan, of Boston, in four rounds, easily.

In the second round Daily tried left and right, but was blocked. Gans stood off waiting for an opening and sent his right swinging on the jaw, dropping Daily to the floor.

Inside of three seconds, only to get a couple of hard lifts in the neck, and despite many earnest efforts with both hands the Delaware man was unable to reach the colored man's body.

Gans kept punching for a few minutes, but Daily continued to force matters, and showed that he was being too clever. Gans was quite willing to let Daily do the hard work.

In the twenty-fifth round they shook hands and Gans went to his room with a left on the face, and Daily sent back a left chop on the neck.

Gans put a hard left on the face and Daily sent his left to the neck, and his nose began to bleed again, and Joe sent his right upped to the breast.

CONSULTED WITH CARDINALS

ROME, Dec. 27.—The Associated Press is informed, on the best authority in Rome, that the pope has issued a formal order directing that attacks on the ecclesiastical policy known as "Americanism" must cease.

The fight against Americanism, carried on in Europe for some time more or less systematically, reached its climax in the form of the Paulist, and against the Paulist community by a French priest, Magrien.
