Dungan, Detroit's big right-fielder, has batted about .900 during the series just closed. The Wolverines are all hard hitters.

Barrett, who is playing center for Detroit, has been sold to Cincinnati, and will play there next year.

With a charming regularity Detroit gets three runs in the ninth! It has put three bases over the plate in the ninth in each of the last three games and has needed part or all of the three in each.

St. Paul, however, is not entitled to win any games in which it gets only five hits in five different innings.

Schratt scratched a lucky hit through the short field that would have been easy for Schratt had he not run up to cut Barrett off on an attempted steal. The hit sent Barrett to third, and Schratt stole second. Dungan followed with a single over Geler that
