G. N. RAILROAD REPORT

PRESIDENT HILL'S STATEMENT FOR THE STOCKHOLDERS OF THE SYSTEM

BUILDING UP THE BIG ROAD

A Reduction in the Operating Expenses of the Road is Shown—Details of the Improvements That Have Been Made—Acquisition of New Lines and Feeders—Traffic and Rates.

The tenth annual report of the Great Northern Railway company, covering the work of the year in detail, was made public yesterday. The report shows a general advance along all lines. A significant feature of the controller's report is the percentage of operating expenses to gross earnings, which shows a reduction over the year ending June 30, 1898, of 1.15 per cent.

The report of the president gives much interesting information. The first part refers to the authorized issue of bonds and stocks, giving summaries for the year, after which the physical condition of the road is discussed. In regard to new lines and improvements on the system, the report says:

The St. Paul, Minneapolis & Manitoba Railway company has built no branch or new line during the year, under the provisions of the Pacific Northwest Railroad company, from Seattle, Washington, to Spokane, Wash., and from Columbia, 159.10 miles, was operated from and after Aug. 1, 1898, as a part of the line of this company.

Another acquisition. The Eastern Railway Company of Minnesota has been purchased by the Great Northern Railway company, and has since operated it as a portion of its Northern division.

Reference was made in last year's report to the acquisition by this company of the Spokane Falls and Northern Railway company, which was completed July 1, 1898. During the year under review the Spokane Falls and Northern system was operated separately.

The report of the year stated that there had been purchased during the year 1,200 freight cars, 250 passenger cars, 1,000 locomotives and 1,500 freight engines. The total cost of these purchases was \$10,000,000.

The equipment with air brakes and automatic couplers of freight cars has been actively engaged during the year. About 92 per cent of the cars belonging to the system are now so fitted as to conform to the act of Congress.
