TRAVELING MAN'S DEATH. Edward E. Blanchard, Well Known in the Northwest, Passes Away.

Edwards E. Blanchard, a traveling salesman, formerly of this city, but recently in the employ of a Cincinnati firm, died at the city hospital yesterday morning from pneumonia. NO SINGLE SEASON

TO CONTRACT THE POWERS OF ST. PAUL'S NEW CARNIVAL ASSOCIATION

WINTER OR SUMMER ALIKE

To Tempt the New Devotees of Fun and Frolic to Ventures in Behalf of the Popular Pleasure Which Will Be Planned More Definitely Later It Will Be Incorporated Legally.

The St. Paul Carnival association, an organization designed to promote carnival festivities in the city without special regard to season, was organized at an enthusiastic meeting last night at the Commercial club. Arrangements were made to incorporate at once, and substantial progress in securing membership and enlisting the co-operation of clubs and societies of different sorts throughout the city. A board of directors was named, made up from those most interested in the project.

Mayor Kiefer presided and outlined the object of the session, stating that he was requested by the Commercial club to invite representatives of the numerous organizations in the city to be present for the purpose of forming a carnival club to promote the welfare of the city. He called upon H. T. Black to outline the purpose of the proposed association. The latter, after a provisional plan had been adopted, was appointed to draw up a plan of organization, with by-laws, subject to such change as might become necessary. Mr. Black presented the report of the committee. It was the purpose to form an association which should have no limitations as to time and season, so as to hold either winter or summer carnivals as seemed fit. On the same line it was intended to provide a permanent organization to avoid individual and contingent liabilities it seemed best to work out a plan by which an association might be incorporated under the state laws. The officers of the association shall be: president, twenty-five or more; treasurer, recording secretary and corresponding secretary, all to be elected by a vote of the members. The members shall be fifteen directors, chosen by the association. Every resident of the city of St. Paul, who shall become entitled to a vote upon the payment of the sum of \$1.
